Stone informed commissioners of his purchase of the Lincoln Journal from Wilkes Publishing Co, Inc. earlier in the day. *The Journal* is the legal organ for Lincoln County for all official notices involving the County Commission and other government agencies. Stone told commissioners that the Journal will continue current publication practices and employees and expand in the future.

Department Reports

Planning and Zoning: June permits were issued for 8 new single-family homes, 1 manufactured home move out permit, 5 re-inspection/renewal/penalties; 1 commercial permit; 12 alterations/renovation/addition permits; 8 accessory permits; 10 demolition permits; 9 electrical; 7 HVAC; 1 solar; 6 plumbing; 1 roofing; and 3 well service/temp pole/irrigation permits; all permits totaling \$8765.50. Director Roby Seymour presented the first reading changes to the Land Development Ordinance Sec. 34-201 and Buildings Ordinance Sec. 18-9 and 18-47.

Finance: Commissioners approved a postage meter lease presented by Finance Director Ernie Doss and the UGA Extension payroll contract.

Emergency Services: June calls included 102 transports, 44 EMS, and six fires, with an average response time of 8.5 minutes.

Recreation: Lincoln County Recreation Director LeTrellis Glaze reported the installation of the jump pillow is underway and is expected to be ready in mid-August. Soccer registration is ongoing and the recreation department is currently hosting the Family Connections summer camp program Monday – Thursday.

Public Works Water: June collections total \$105,446.78, which covers water, sewer, availability customers, setup, and tap fees. The department installed five service connections and repaired three leaks on the system; performed continued maintenance on hydrants, valves, and meters; performed locates for utilities; and performed maintenance on the Savannah Bay and Pointe Shores water systems.

to fix it," Goldman said. Council requested that Goldman begin a search on a replacement truck. Goldman also stated the first Self-Contained Breathing Apparatus has been received. He received the go-ahead from Brown to order the second. Goldman's report showed that the department answered one call during the month of June.

Building and Code Enforcement: The council reviewed the monthly planning and zoning report by Building and Code Enforcement Officer Larry Goolsby which showed thirteen building, one demolition, and one moving permit were issued and one variance application was issued during the month of June totaling \$1,268.75. Goolsby performed 14 inspections on building permits, 2 building, fire and safety inspections, held five meetings with property owners/contractors, and addressed two complaints/related issues during the month.

Water Treatment Plant: Alligood's Wastewater Treatment report showed that the approximate influent for Lincoln County was 600,000 gallons, while the influent for the city approximately 4.9 million gallons. Treated effluent that was discharged was a little over 5.5 million gallons. Routine facility, equipment, and grounds maintenance was performed, along with the line repairs, and the clearing of clogged sewer mains. Sampling data has also been completed and recorded. The report also indicated that the department lost no time due to accidents or incidents.

Water Treatment Plant Supervi-

sor Jody Lee's report showed that 18.4 million gallons of water were treated, with 16.7 million gallons sent to distribution which includes 9.3 million gallons sold to the county during the month of June. Rainfall for the month was recorded at 5.3 inches, with Clarks Hill reservoir at 330.5 feet.

Both emergency generators were tested weekly with no problems found. The raw fuel tank is full and the plan fuel tank is half full. The plant generator ran for approximately 20 hours over June 24-25, due to a blown fuse in the Georgia Power transformer. High service pumps three and four are still awaiting parts for repair.
