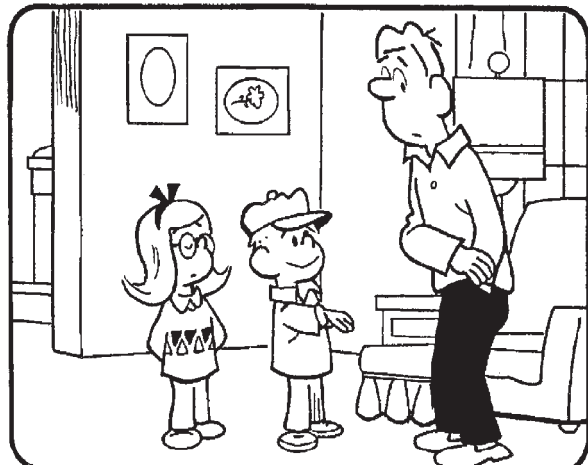
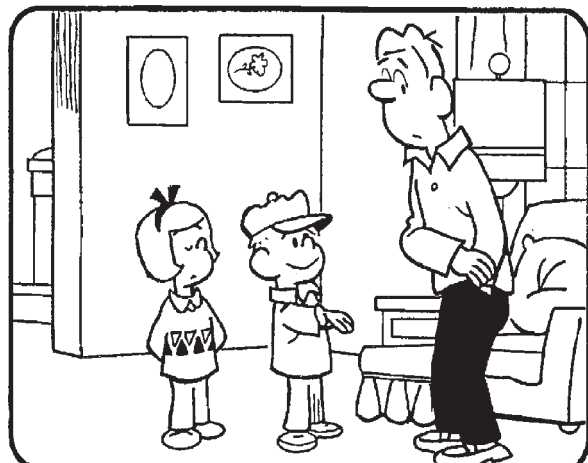

Find at least six differences in details between panels.



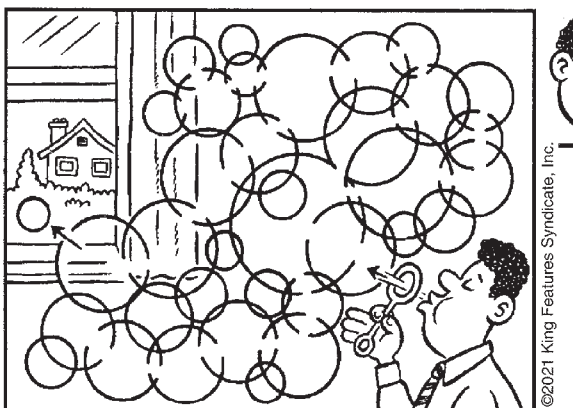

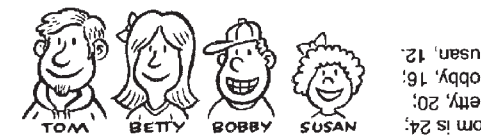
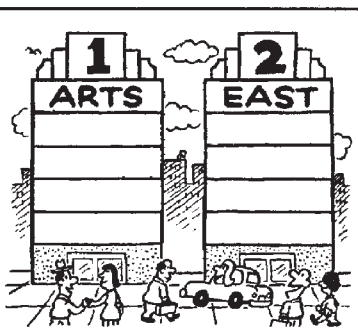
A TRICKY PROBLEM!
