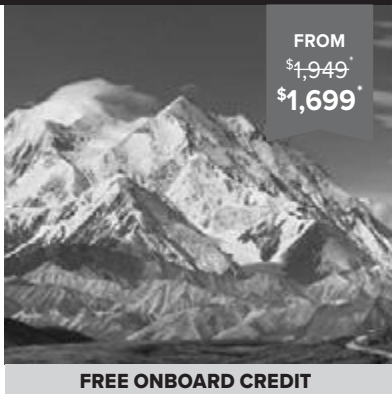

Ty Cobb exhibit at museum

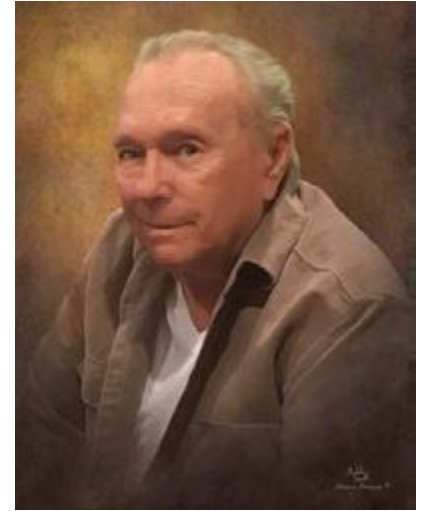
