

# Try these fresh rhubarb recipes

A cloudy morning after a beautiful yesterday! Dad's aches during the night predict more rain. We've been getting a nice amount of rain. Lawns are a beautiful green.

Today I'm busy cooking for the Decatur Auto Auction and delivery to various locations tomorrow.

Last weekend was busy with dinners here at the house.

Here's some rhubarb recipes to try with fresh rhubarb.

### Rhubarb Pie

1 1/3 c sugar  
1/3 c. flour  
1/8 tsp. salt  
4 c. rhubarb, cut up in 1/2-inch pieces

Combine sugar, flour, and salt. Add 1/2 teaspoon red food coloring to rhubarb. Mix all together. Put in crust. Put crust on top. Brush with milk and sprinkle with sugar. Bake at 425 degrees for 40 to 50 minutes or until juice bubbles out of vents.

### Rhubarb Cream Pie

3 egg yolks  
1 c. cream  
1 scant c. sugar  
3 heaping Tbsp. flour  
Dash of salt  
2 c. diced rhubarb  
Mix yolks and cream. Mix flour, sugar, and salt and add to mixture. Put rhubarb in unbaked pie shell and pour mixture over it. Bake until rhubarb is tender. Reserve egg whites for making meringue, beating them with sugar and spreading over pie. Bake until meringue browns at 350 degrees.

### Rhubarb Torte

Crust:  
3/4 c. butter  
2 c. flour  
2 Tbsp. sugar  
Custard:  
6 egg yolks  
1 c. cream of milk

2 c. sugar  
7 Tbsp. flour  
5 c. chopped rhubarb  
Meringue:  
6 egg whites  
3/4 c. sugar  
1/4 tsp. salt  
1 tsp. vanilla  
1/4 tsp. cream of tartar  
Mix crust ingredients until crumbly. Pat into a 9"x13" pan. Bake at 350 degrees for 10 minutes. Beat egg yolks and milk; add sugar, flour, and salt. Stir in rhubarb. Pour over crust. Bake at 350 degrees for 45 minutes or until custard is set. Meringue: Beat egg whites until stiff. Gradually add rest of ingredients. Spread over custard layer. Bake at 350 degrees for 15 minutes.

### Rhubarb Crisp

1 c. flour  
1 c. brown sugar  
1 stick oleo, melted  
3/4 c. rolled oats  
1 tsp. cinnamon  
1 c. sugar  
2 Tbsp. cornstarch  
1 c. water  
1 tsp. vanilla  
4 c. diced rhubarb  
Mix first five ingredients until crumbly. Press 1/2 of crumbs into greased 9-inch pan. Cover with rhubarb. Combine sugar, cornstarch, water, and vanilla and cook until clear. Pour over rhubarb and top with remaining crumbs. Bake at 350 degrees for one hour.

### Rhubarb Nut Bread

1/2 c. brown sugar  
1/3 c. vegetable oil  
1 egg  
1 c. sour milk  
1 tsp. vanilla  
1 tsp. soda  
1/2 tsp. salt  
2 1/2 c. flour  
1/2 c. rhubarb, cut fine  
1/2 c. chopped nuts  
Sugar mixture:  
1/2 c. sugar  
1 tsp. cinnamon  
Mix brown sugar, oil, and egg. Add sour milk and

vanilla. Add dry ingredients and mix well. Stir in rhubarb and nuts. Put in 2 bread pans. Sprinkle the sugar mixture on top. Bake at 325 degrees for 40 minutes.

### Rhubarb Cake

1/2 c. shortening  
1 1/2 c. brown sugar  
1 egg  
1 c. sour milk

1 tsp. soda  
2 c. flour  
1 1/2 c. finely cut up rhubarb

Mix all together. Pour in greased and floured 9x12 pan inch pan. Mix together 1/2 c. sugar and 1 teaspoon cinnamon. Sprinkle over unbaked cake. Bake 30 to 35 minutes in oven at 350 degrees.

## Miller shuts out Blue Ridge, Knights defeated by Mahomet-Seymour

Nik Miller did not allow a single run as the Arthur Lovington Atwood Hammond Knights defeated the Blue Ridge Knights 13-0 on Wednesday. Miller allowed just two hits in the contest.

ALAH opened up the scoring in the first inning, when Logan Brough singled on a 1-2 count, scoring one run.

The Knights notched five runs in the fourth inning. The offensive firepower for Arthur Lovington Atwood Hammond was led by Miller, Kody Kornewald, Clay Seal, and Hunter Grant, all driving in runs in the frame.

Miller was credited with the victory for ALAH and he went five innings, allowing zero runs on two hits, striking out 11 and walking one.

Miller also led the Knights with two hits in two at bats as ALAH tore up the base paths with two players stealing at least two bases.

Wyatt Hilligoss led the way with two.

Reynolds took the loss for Blue Ridge. The hurler went two innings, allowing eight runs on six hits and striking out two.

The Knights were on the road Thursday night as they traveled to Mahomet to take on the Bulldogs.

Arthur Lovington Atwood Hammond watched the game slip away early and couldn't recover in an 4-11 loss to Mahomet-Seymour.

The Bulldogs scored on a sacrifice fly by Zac Carr, a sacrifice fly by Carter Selk, a double by Nolan Nierenhausen, a single by Nate McFall, and a single by Chase Wagers in the second inning.

The Knights struggled to put runs on the board and had a tough time defensively containing Mahomet-Seymour, giving up 11 runs.

Brady Borntrager took the loss for ALAH. He allowed nine hits and 11 runs over three and two-thirds innings, striking out one.

Wyatt Hilligoss and Nik Miller both managed multiple hits for the Knights. Hilligoss led ALAH with three hits in four at bats as they collected a total of seven hits in the game.

Wagers earned the victory on the hill for Mahomet-Seymour. Wagers surrendered one run on one hit over three innings, striking out two and walking one.

Mahomet-Seymour tallied 13 hits as Selk, Wagers, McFall, Sampson, and Nierenhausen each had multiple hits for Mahomet-Seymour. The Bulldogs did not commit a single error in the field.

## Douglas County COVID clinic changes ahead

Since the final days of December 2020, Douglas County Health Department has held weekly clinics in order to vaccinate willing residents as a safeguard against COVID-19. We are so very proud of and grateful for the 5,000-plus community members who have made that commitment to protect themselves, their families, friends, co-workers and fellow citizens by becoming fully vaccinated.

Because the number of first-dose appointment requests is decreasing, DCHD is now looking at changing the way it conducts vaccine clinics in an effort to best utilize staff resources while still providing this life-saving immunization to the public. After the May 15 scheduled mass vaccination clinic at North Ward Elementary School in Tuscola (appointments still available for Moderna first and second doses and Pfizer second doses), DCHD will not be conducting vaccinations the week of May 17. Instead, managers will be mapping out the new strategy.

COVID vaccination ef-

forts will resume the week of May 25, and the likely scenario will be conducting drive-thru clinics by appointment several days a week at DCHD's J600 site in Tuscola Outlet Mall. The same online registration process will probably remain, and more specific details will be made available sometime next week. Please note that should circumstances warrant it, there may be occasional mass vaccination clinics held in the future.

In the meantime, we encourage anyone who is eligible for vaccination to give serious consideration to doing so. It is free, essentially painless, and requires just a small amount of your time. Besides the obvious health benefits, additional perks of full vaccination include often no quarantine is required if you are identified as a close contact to a COVID-positive person, and your presence doesn't count against capacity limits in many situations. 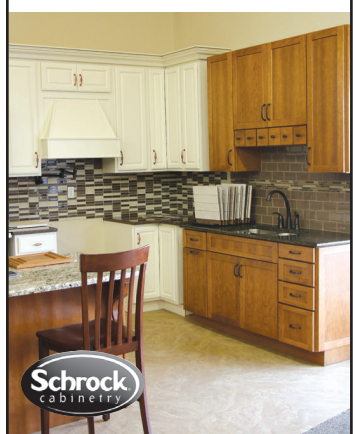
