for a Cure" game. Players sold pink and black t-shirts with breast cancer ribbons on them in advance, and pink bracelets were also sold at the door of the April 14th match-

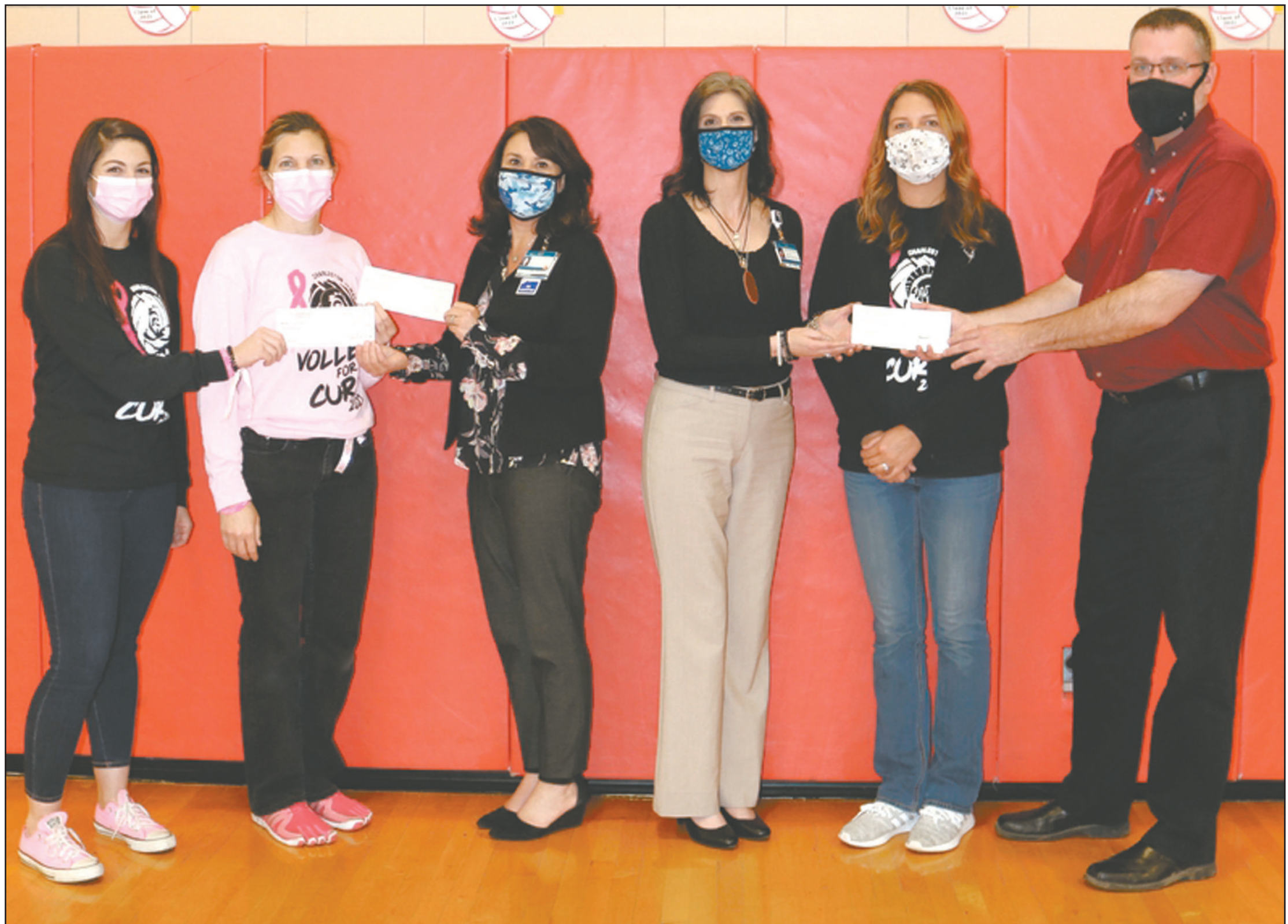
up, hosted by Charleston High School.
