with no exceptions. Only students who are both unvaccinated and under a quarantine order from the Illinois Department of Health will be eligible to continue remote learning.

A spokeswoman for ISBE said they expect the bulk of the population eligible for remote learning at the start of the school year to be under 12 years old.

"We encourage families to use the summer months to ensure that

eligible children get vaccinated," she said. "The vaccines are safe, effective, and proven to protect you from getting sick."

Students who do not qualify for remote learning may seek home or hospital instruction if a doctor determines they will miss at least 10 days of school due to a medical condition.

According to the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, the Pfizer-BioNtech vaccine is safe for children 12 and over, while everyone aged 16 and over is eligible to receive any U.S. approved

vaccine. Pfizer may file for emergency use authorization of its vaccine from the U.S. Food and Drug Administration for use in children aged 2 to 11 in September, according to news reports.

"As always, our top priority is our students, and we know that in most cases, in-person learning is in their best interest," Ayala said in her blog post. "Now that we have every indication that the pandemic will soon be behind us, we can prepare to return fully to the physical spaces that best provide these conditions."

BOOK A TOUR OR WALK-THRU



The 1882 Daniel Schrock house will feature exhibits on Amish history and religion, quilts, clothing, and Amish culture. Exhibits in the 1866 Moses Yoder house will highlight the structural research and restoration of the house, the Yoder workshop will feature Amish barns, and the 1920 Miller School will interpret Amish education. The site will be open for tours and walk-throughs on Fridays and Saturdays, 9:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. starting June 4.

The Illinois Amish Heritage Center began its fifth year by moving the historic Miller Amish German schoolhouse in April. The Miller school joins the 1882 Schrock house and the 1866 Yoder house along with the Yoder workshop at the IAHC campus and will help interpret early Illinois Amish life to site visitors.

The IAHC will be open to the public on Fridays and Saturdays this summer starting in June 4 & 5.

The Schrock house will include exhibits on Amish history and Amish culture as well as exhibit panels explaining the historical aspects of the house as it was built in 1882 by Daniel Schrock. A modern restroom was recently added to the back of the Schrock house as well as a modern kitchen which will allow the site to host meetings, dinners, and educational programs. The school will include an exhibit on its use as a German school as well as Amish education and today's school children will be able to sit at the desks where Amish youth studied a century ago.
