


brother, Lawrence Hampel. Cheryl was a 1963 graduate of Champaign High School.

William C. Jones William C. "Bill" Jones died on Tuesday, September 7, 2021. Bill was born April 7, 1931 in Tuscola, IL, the son of Representative George A. Jones and Cecily (Blackford). He was a member of Forty Martyrs Catholic Church in Tuscola where he was also married to Jean Kennedy Jones on September 12, 1953.

Bill graduated from Tuscola High School in 1949.

He received a bachelor's degree from the College of Agriculture at the University of Illinois in 1953. He was a member of Sigma Chi Fraternity and he was a member of the Army ROTC. Upon graduation, Bill joined the 11th Armored Cavalry regiment where he was an executive officer and was made first lieutenant.

Bill was a farmer near the small town of Bourbon, IL and in his later years became an accomplished inventor also. He received four patents, one of which was featured on the front page of the Wall Street Journal, was used in the TV sitcom Home Improvement with Tim Allen, and was also exhibited for several years in EPCOT at the Walt Disney World Resort.
