Construction on the \$8 Million House will begin in Spring 2022 and will be located on the north side of Sarah Bush Lincoln. The Foundation is raising \$1 million to help offset construction costs and another \$1.5 million to build an endowment to help those without resources pay for their stay in the hospice house. The donation from SC3F will help build the endowment.
