OSF Saint Anthony's nears century of service to region

As health care transforms, health organizations have seen an increasing need to provide more coordinated care and improved access to strengthen communities' social and economic health.

"We continue to hear from the community about the need to provide all necessary services here, locally," Rumph said. "Our patients don't want to cross the river to St Louis for their care. They want to stay close to home. To that end, we are adding new providers, technologies and virtual options."

One of the areas where OSF Saint Anthony's has made the greatest

strides is in the battle against cancer.

"We are proud of the OSF Moeller Cancer Center because it provides the latest advanced cancer care options, infusion treatments and radiation therapies. And, recently, we started participating in clinical trials," Rumph said. "While all cancers are different, there is a greater chance that people will no longer need to cross the river to see a cancer physician or receive treatments in St Louis. We provide these cancer treatments locally at OSF Saint Anthony's."

The OSF Moeller Cancer Center is fully accredited by the Commission on Cancer from the American College of Surgeons.

"We are very proud of the exceptional care we provide," Rumph said.

In addition, OSF Saint Anthony's is a "4" Star rated hospital by the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services. And the hospital has achieved a Grade "A" from the LeapFrog Group for patient safety and quality care, a Gold Plus Quality Award from the American Heart Association for stroke care and their stroke program is fully accredited by the Joint Commission on Accreditation of Healthcare Organizations.

"We strive to provide exceptional quality and compassionate care to all who come to OSF Saint Anthony's in need of help," Rumph said.

Anderson Healthcare progressing on new addition to Goshen Campus

Work is well underway on a 50,000-square-foot addition to the medical building on the Goshen Campus of Anderson Hospital.

Representatives from Anderson Healthcare, Triple Net Management, The Korte Company, and City of Edwardsville ceremoniously broke ground in May.

Anderson Healthcare
President and CEO, Keith
Page said the unique twostory building will help the hospital
consolidate many of its Anderson
Medical Group primary care practices into one convenient location.

The facility will have clinical space for approximately 20 providers.

In addition to Anderson Medical Group physicians, the building will house several outpatient services including an imaging center, urgent care, lab services and outpatient rehab therapies. The imaging center will be known as the Goshen Imaging Center and will be an affiliate of the Maryville Imaging Center located in Maryville. Discussions are also underway to offer urgent care services specific to pediatrics.

The project, approximately \$20 million, is being developed by Triple Net Management. Triple Net Management is led by Terry Johnson, a veteran commercial real estate broker and developer with 35 years' experience in office, retail, investment, and land sales.

The project was approved by the Illinois Health Facilities and Services Review Board earlier this year. Anderson has also been working with closely with the City of Edwardsville's Planning and Zoning Division.

The project is slated to be complete in summer 2022.

This building is going up on the northwest quadrant of the Anderson Healthcare Goshen Campus. The campus is situated on Goshen Road across from the Meyer Center YMCA and adjacent to District Drive. Access to the medical building will be via the main entrance on Goshen, as well as another entrance off of District Drive. The building is being designed by The Korte Company.

The Anderson Healthcare Goshen Campus opened its first building anchored by Anderson Surgery Center and SSM Health Cardinal Glennon Children's Hospital Specialty Clinic last fall.

Rehab hospital opens on Edwardsville campus

A free-standing rehabilitation hospital, known as Anderson Rehabilitation Institute, opened this summer on the Goshen Campus. It is a joint venture between Anderson Healthcare and Kindred Healthcare.

The facility will provide care to patients recovering from stroke, traumatic brain injury, spinal cord injury, amputation, and other complex conditions. Staff will provide physical, occupational, and speech therapy. Other special services provided will include physiatry, internal medicine, medical/surgical consultations, rehabilitation nursing and nutritional services. The institute will have a dedicated pharmacy.

The 49,920-square-foot facility has 34 beds and features all private rooms; a secured acquired brain injury unit with private dining and therapy gym; large interdisciplinary gym for all therapy services; transitional living apartment designed to simulate a residential apartment, to prepare patients for their daily living tasks before they are discharged home; and a therapeutic courtyard with exterior amenities.

It also has specially designed rooms to treat dialysis patients; and specialty programs dedicated to neuro, stroke, brain injury, and amputation. For more information about Anderson Rehabilitation Institute, visit www.andersonrehabinstitute.com.

Kindred manages the day-to-day operations of Anderson Rehabilitation Institute and Anderson Hospital provides any medical support services. The new institute replaces a 20-bed hospital-based acute rehabilitation unit at Anderson Hospital that Kindred has managed since 2004.

Anderson Rehabilitation Institute expects to serve more than 800 patients each year. The average length of stay for patients is approximately two weeks. The facility design has been implemented at several Kindred rehabilitation hospitals throughout the country with significant success in enhancing patient outcomes and improving their quality of life.



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
