## Milan FUMC continues to grow

The Milan First United Methodist Church was founded in 1866 and its first church building was erected in 1867. Over the years several new buildings were erected as church membership grew.

Milan FUMC met in a spacious new building, erected in 1928 at 2029 South Main St. in Milan. Additional classrooms and recreational facilities were added in 1957.

Between 1929 and 1999, many exciting events occurred within the church while at this location. One of these events was in 1973 when the Carter-Rankin circle organized and sponsored The Mustard Seed, a goodwill ministry providing food, clothing and assistance for people in need. This organization is now staffed by volunteers from community churches.

Recent years have brought many blessings and improvements to the Milan FUMC, including a new church building erected at 2000 Jones Blvd. in Milan in 1999. This building is currently still the home of Milan FUMC and is led by Brother Ronnie Peck.
