Established in March of 1889, the Dyer Church of Christ has been a part of the Dyer community for 133 years. It was first located on the corner of Madison and South Streets. In 1904, a new building was built on the site and they met there until December 3, 1978, when they moved to the present location at 889 south Main St.

The property at the corner of Madison and South street was sold the Keely Mill

Baptist Church. In 1987, the house and lot at 369 Parkview Dr, was purchased as a residence for the preacher of the Church of Christ.

Berea Baptist Church began in the early 1980s as a mission outreach of Emmanuel Baptist Church in Jackson. Launching as Trenton Baptist Mission and initially led by Bro. James Tacker and later by Bro. Thomas Fortner, the work grew. In 1990, the congregation purchased land and built its first building. On August 17, 1990, Trenton Baptist Mission was formally organized into a church, changed its name to Berea Baptist Church, and called Bro. Thomas Fortner as its first pastor. In 1997, the church added a second building with more Sunday school rooms and a fellowship hall.

Throughout its history, the church has had three pastors, Bro. Thomas Fortner, Bro bobby Adams, and its current pastor, Bro. Greg Wells. The church continues working to fulfill the great commission given by Jesus Christ, to preach the gospel to every creature and make disciples of all believers.

Berea Baptist Church strives to serve the present generation and provide hope for the

future while desiring to obey the two great commandments: love the Lord first and love our neighbors as ourselves.
