"To keep being competitive, it forces us to step up and play better because we know these other teams are going to do the same," Coach Reid said. "The quality of games in our district look to be very good this season,"

Coach Reid acknowledged the biggest challenge in coaching is keeping the girls in the gym, "If a boy sees a ball rolling across the gym floor they run out and start shooting it. That's not the natural response for some girls. So we have to instill a love for the game in that they want to spend time in the gym even when it's not the official practice time. And we are seeing a turn in this area."

The schedule closes with five of the eight final games being at home. All of the games are district games. The importance of a strong home crowd cannot be emphasized enough. The early start time means sacrificing to get to the gym but it will be worth the effort to see these ladies battling it out.

"The enthusiasm of the fans affects what happens on the court. Once these girls get going, the fans will experience some good basketball," Coach Reid said.
