Col. Charles D. Planer is the Director of Operations, 4th Air Force, Air Force Reserve Command, March Air Reserve Base, Calif. Fourth Air Force has readiness and command responsibility of over 300 units and 28,000 personnel. Specifically, he directs operations of the Reserve's long-range airlift, OSA/VIP airlift, airdrop, air-refueling, aeromedical evacuation and expeditionary support activities across 15 flying wings and one flying group.

Col. Planer entered the U.S. Air Force in 1988 shortly after graduating from the University of Oklahoma. He served as an active duty navigator until 1993 followed by entry into reserve service. In 1998 he earned the Distinguished Graduate from undergraduate pilot training. His flying experience encompasses numerous C-17/KC-135 combat/combat support missions, during and since Operation Desert Shield/Storm was a C-40 pilot and Group Commander in charge of transporting the First Lady of the United States.



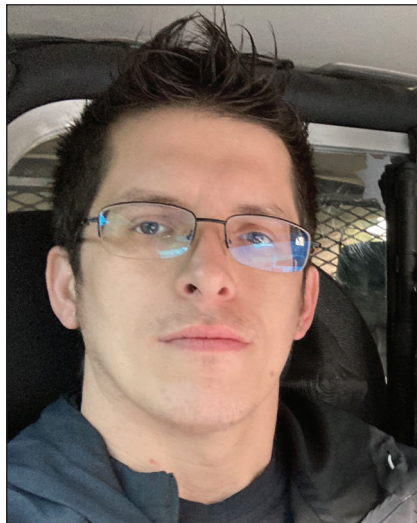
