Strength in numbers for Tigers, new head coach

Courier Sports GORDONSVILLE - A changing of the guard during this offseason for the Gordonsville High Tigers football program has added hype and intrigue to an already electric time around "Tiger Town" — as the Class 1A power prepares to return to the gridiron this fall.

GHS Class of 2003 graduate and former coach for the Big Blue, Stephen Jackson, was named the new head coach at Gordonsville High in late January.

The Tigers welcomed Jackson back to his alma mater after Scott Clemons, who had led the program for the previous four seasons and captured three region titles, announced his resignation.

Jackson built an impressive resume prior to being tabbed for his first head coaching job

Before returning to Gordonsville, Jackson was an assistant for head coach Kevin Creasy's 6A juggernaut Oakland where he was on three state championship winning staffs (2018, 2020, 2021).

Jackson also helped guide perennial Middle Tennessee prep football powerhouse Trousdale County to 14-0 campaign in 2013 that was capped off by a Class 2A State Title —

the most recent championship won by the program.

The former Gordonsville High lineman looks to bring his experience and philosophy to his alma mater — a process that began for Jackson this spring and summer.

"This offseason has been awesome," said Jackson. "We have been in the weight room hitting it hard. We have gotten bigger, faster and stronger. We have been trying to build some team leaders. I think that is a key in a football team is having team leaders."

Jackson continued, "We have done some things with leadership. I think they have come to work everyday and they are getting better everyday. It is going to be a good year for us."

The new mentor for the Tigers has had a chance to prepare the team for what they can expect preparation-wise through out the year.

"We had scrimmages with DeKalb County and Livingston," said Jackson. We also played Livingston in the jamboree.

Jackson continued, "I like using the weeks leading up to the season like they are game weeks — so they know what we expect from our practices through the week — Monday through Thursday."

"Just trying to teach them our philosophies of when we are going to be physical in practice and when we are not going to be physical and when is a mental day. That is what we have been doing as we work toward game week.

If strength in numbers holds true for the Big Blue the Tigers will have a superpower as the team boast a

strong 72-player squad. The unit includes 20 senior Tigers featuring All-State selections from a year ago in quarterback Matthew

Albritton and linebacker Will Dudney.

Albritton and Dudney have been key pieces for Gordonsville in previous seasons seeing playing time in their freshman, sophomore and junior seasons. Albritton joined the varsity GHS squad during his eighth grade year.

Other key returnees include seniors Peyton Climer, Bryson AUG. 20 Cripps, Bryson Greer, Lucas AUG. 26 Roberts, Drew Hughes, Mitcheal Payne and Ethan Elkins.


