He does a great job with our offense, getting the most out of our guys and getting them in positions where they are able to succeed.' JASON HARVILLE "Coach Jason Harville did a great job last year with our defense and he is going to do another phenomenal job this year – being able to keep the verbiage the same, keep guys in the same position, another vear of our defensive system and we are going to have a great defensive line. We have two good linebackers. Coach Harville is in charge of the secondary and he is going to have those guys prepared." BILLY BARNHART Coach Barnhart is our offensive and defensive linemen coach. He does a great job with our offensive and defensive line. They are very well prepared each week - being able to talk, communicate with each other up front and knowing our blocking schemes. They take a certain pride in our physical brand of football. In 2020, we averaged 60 to 70 rushing yards per game - last year we averaged over 230 rushing yards a game. That goes on the back of our offensive line, Coach Barnhart and the great job they did with nearly the same group. We are looking for that same improvement this year - so those offensive linemen can eat. ALEX BRAY - "Coach Bray is coaching our cornerbacks and our "X" receivers. He comes back from last year to also do some special teams for us. BRIAN HACKETT –"A guy we are adding to our staff this year is Coach Brian Hackett. He is going to coach our outside linebacker - "Star" position on defense. He is an offensive analyst. It is great to have Coach Brian back. He is an alumni of Smith County and he was a position coach here for years. He helped Coach (Jimmy) Maynard and Coach (Chuck) Gentry at Cookeville for a year. He has been out of it - but now he is back and we are glad to have him and he is a great asset for our team.'


STEVE BRAY -- "Coach Bray is our field guy and keeps our field looking great. He keeps our field looking great along with Smith Farmers Co-Op.'
