RCH Announces New CEO, Addresses Nurse Retention

After an hour of intense discussion and debate, the Russell County Hospital Board tackled two pressing issues: obtaining a new CEO, and addressing a nursing shortage.

The board met in special session Friday where they announced not only the securing of a CEO, but adoption of a plan to retain nurses being heavily recruited by other healthcare entities.

Scott Thompson, who served as CEO at Russell County Hospital (RCH) from September 2018 to December 2019, will return to the local healthcare facility as CEO once again effective May 1.

Thompson mostly recently served as Chief Executive

Officer for Select Specialty Hospital-Central Kentucky since June of 2021.

RCH Attorney Jeff Hoover said he reviewed a contract offered to Thompson, and "it got signed earlier today (Friday)."

The hospital board began looking for a new CEO after announcing just over two weeks ago they, and former Patrick J. Branco had "mutually agreed to terminate our employment relationship."

An issue the board wishes Thompson to address is a current nursing shortage at RCH.

The board voted Friday to award nurses with a \$2,000 bonus, and raise overtime
