Cabinet of Economic Development...for funds to be used for site development and infrastructure improvements."

Witt said area development districts across the state were recently asked to present sites for consideration.

"In terms of immediate outcome from the presentation, I don't think we know yet," he said. "We had a really good conversation with the governor and (Senior Advisor to Kentucky Governor Andy Beshear) Rocky Adkins afterwards, so that was good."

Witt said there has been recent interest expressed in Russell County from at least two industries.

"We're getting hits," he said. "We've been busy responding."

Witt presented the authority with a report regarding the inquiries.

"It gives you a good perspective of all the things we're working on," he said.

The authority, itself, did not know specifics about some of the requests because due to its competitive nature, industrial recruitment is a delicate, detailed, and often confidential process.

Witt said he believes good things are on the horizon.

"I don't think it's a coincidence we presented in front of Economic Development earlier

this month...and we got these inquiries," he said.

"I hope we hear something within the next month or two," he said.

Witt said Russell County has recruitment strength, and stands out over other areas by having the only Certified, Food & Beverage Shovel-Ready site in the state.

A stand-out of the Lake Cumberland Regional Industrial Complex, located in the French Valley area, is an up to 250,000 square-foot site boasting a "pad ready" designation.

A "pad ready" site is attractive," Witt said, because an interested industry "could start building on it tomorrow."

"There's a lot in the market right now," he said. "We need to push that pad-ready site."

RCIDA Member Scott Pierce asked about the possibility of building a second, pad-ready site.

"I would say yes," Witt said, "but if you're going to invest more money...I would consider buying more property."

He said additional land would offer "more flexibility" when trying to recruit industry with unique or challenging needs.

Good land is available at the site, Witt said, but he told the authority they need to consider the

needs of prospective industry.

"If a project comes in that needs 100 acres and they need it to lay a certain way, and our current property doesn't work," Witt said, "(Additional land) is something to consider."

RCIDA Board Chairman Clint Voils said an effort should be made to identify available property for possible purchase in the future.

Russell Springs Mayor Eddie Thomas praised Witts for his efforts on behalf of the industrial authority.

"I've seen him work...saw him present in Frankfort," the mayor said. "I was really impressed. I'd put him up against anybody."

Mayor Thomas said work is underway on a road to connect two pieces of property behind the Five Star off U.S. 127 near the Louie B. Nunn Cumberland Parkway.

The RCIDA welcomed Christopher Ramsey to the board.

Ramsey, who was recently placed on the IDA by the Russell Springs City Council, will fill the seat of long-time authority member Stephen P. Branscum.
