
Lakers and Lady Lakers Busy on the Field

The Russell County Lakers improved to 13-4 on the season after picking up three wins last week. Friday night the Lakers traveled to Clinton County and knocked them off, 2-0. Who can automatically attend?

- ✓ Students who are 4 years old by August 1, 2022 and meet income guidelines (see
- www.russell.kyschools.us) are automatically eligible to attend.
 ✓ Student who is age 3 or 4 with an identified disability can attend to receive specially designed instruction according to the child's *Individualized Education Plan (IEP)*.

Who should register to attend?

- Students whose parents suspect their child may have a disability. Enrollment is then dependent on screening assessment results. Attendance is dependent on results of the screening/Rtl Information, and
- further assessments.
 Students who are 4 by August 1, 2022 and do not meet income guidelines for automatic attendance. As space allows, after all eligible students are enrolled and attending, students will be enrolled in order of registration dates. Enrollment and classroom numbers at each school are determined by the Preschool Coordinator.

What to bring with you?

 Child's birth certificate, 2. Custody papers if applicable, 3. Vision and Health Examination form; 4. Household Income Verification (two weeks of pay stubs or Income Tax Forms)
 Immunizations Certificate
