The Laker Baseball Dynasty continues its reign. Last week the Lakers breezed past Metcalfe and Clinton to clench the 16th District Title.

In the first inning, the Lakers took down the Hornets of Metcalfe County, 12-0. The Lakers secured the win thanks to nine runs driven in by Mayes Gosser, Nathan Lawson, Bryce Cowell, and Maxon Gosser. Multiple hits were scored by Trace Stringer, Maxon Gosser, Mayes Gosser, and Nathan Lawson, who also scored the only home run of the game.

Cody Luttrell was the winning pitcher, lasting four innings, allowing

zero runs on one hit, striking out eight. Nick Aaron came in as relief, pitching the final inning and striking out 4 batters.

In the finals of the tournament, the Lakers easily defeated the Clinton County Bulldogs, 14-0. It was a memory-making night for the nine seniors. In a game that only lasted five innings, the Lakers collected seven hits. Nathan Lawson, Mayes Gosser, Isaac Roy, Maxon Gosser, and Trace Stringer led, offensively for the Lakers. Nathan Lawson was the winning pitcher, lasting five innings, allowing zero runs on three hits, striking out eight and walking one. Lawson finished 2-3 with 4

RBI's, which came off a third-inning grand slam, his 12th home run of the season. Nick Aaron, Nathan Lawson, Isaac Roy, Cody Luttrell, and Trace Stringer were chosen as the All-District Team. The All-District Team is voted on by the baseball coaches in the 16th District.

Russell County Softball All-Season/All-District Team Members

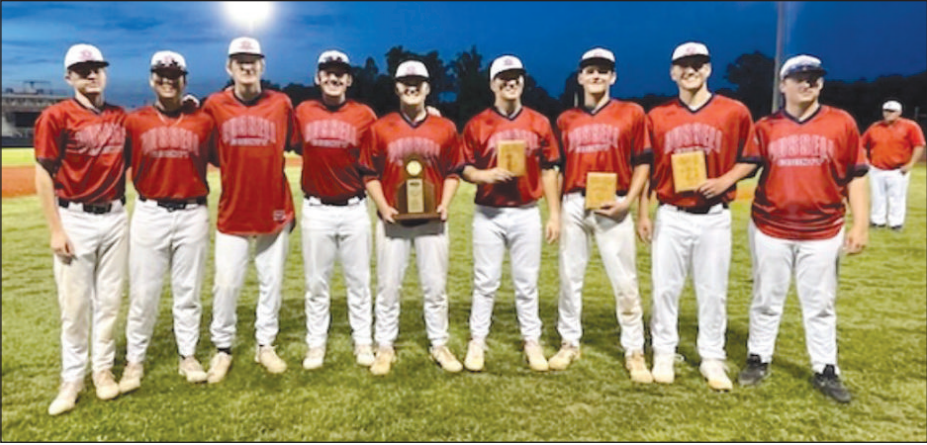
