Seeing her back then at the jail and knowing what had happened, I had hugged her and cried. My heart was broken.

Now here we were, a few years later and Janice looked great. That day at the jail, she was a bruised and battered mess. These days she is a beauty and smiles ear to ear.

Today she was with friends. I wasn't going to mention anything to them about our previous meeting but she pulled me to them. 'This is 'the church lady' that used to come to the jail," she was quick to say.

"I saw her at a really bad time in her life..." I

started. Before I could say other word, she told them everything.

To see her standing there looking so great was such a miracle! Not only has she overcome addiction, but she is using her past pain to help others.

Janice's story drew me to Mark 5:1-20 and the story of the demoniac. He lived in the tombs. No one could bind him or control him. Night and day he cried out and cut himself. That sounds like a life of addiction to me.

Jesus changed the man's life! He took out all the bad and filled him with peace and hope. When people came to see what all the commotion was about, they saw the man who had been demonpossessed sitting there in clothes, in his right mind. He did the same thing for Janice and I am so thankful!

I messaged her on social media to ask what had made the change for her. She wrote, "I was blessed with a merciful judge and loving God that knew I couldn't do it on my own. They saw fit to send me to Hope in the Mountains (a local rehab).'

Bible stories are true. Yes, they happened thousands of years ago, but God is not dead. He still works in people's lives if they let Him. Nothing is impossible with Him!



# ASK Dr. Angelia

There are 2 Paths

**Human Development** Theorist, Erik Erikson postulated 8 Stages of Development throughout the lifespan. Erikson's Stages of Development highlight markers of success and failure within each stage. There are 5 stages in childhood, 1 stage for adolescence, 1 for young adulthood and 2 stages for adulthood. For this writing the focus Middle Adulthood. Middle Adulthood is for the ages of 40-65 entitled: Generativity versus Stagnation. There are 2 paths, either we contribute to our world and society, or we stagnate.

Generativity versus Stagnation is the 7th stage of Erik Erikson's Theory of Psychosocial

Development. During this time, adults strive to create or nurture things that will outlast them; often by parenting children or contributing to positive changes that benefit other people. Contributing to society and doing things to benefit future generations are the important needs. Generativity refers to "making your mark" on the world through caring for others as well as creating and accomplishing things that make the world a better place. Stagnation refers to the failure to find a way to contribute.

Characteristics of stagnation including being self-centered, failing to get involved with others, not taking an interest in productivity, no efforts

to improve the self and placing one 's concerns over above all else. People might reflect on their accomplishments and consider their future trajectory and feel regret. Those who suffer from poor health, poor relationships and feel that they have no control over their fate are more likely to experience feelings of stagnation.

In summary, there are 2 paths. We choose the path we follow. If we contribute to the world, we will get the life satisfaction we need for success. If we do not, we are stagnated. The good news is, it is never too late to change your path.

Remember my friends and readers, embrace 2 Matthew 7:13-15 "There

are two paths before you; you may take only one path. One doorway is narrow. And one door is wide. Go through the narrow door. For the wide door leads to a wide path, and the wide path is broad; the wide, broad path is easy, and the wide, broad, easy path has many, many people on it; but the wide, broad, easy, crowded path leads to death. 14 Now then that narrow door leads to a narrow road that in turn leads to life. It is hard to find that road. Not many people manage it.". Love God and All People.
