In a momentous decision last Friday, the Supreme Court of the United States (SCOTUS) overturned the 1973 landmark Roe v. Wade ruling that allowed abortion to be recognized as a

constitutional right. The Court was split 5-4 for the final vote when they upheld a Mississippi law that banned abortion after 15 weeks of pregnancy

Cynthia joined the US Navy in 1981 and attended basic training in Orlando, FL then proceeded to her first posting at Naval Submarine Support Facility New London in Groton, CT where she worked as a deck hand and ultimately leading seaman on a Navy yard tug assisting the movement of submarines - including ballistic missile submarines - safely through to Long Island Sound.
