Compared to last Wednesday: Feeder steers and bull calves sold 4.00-6.00 lower with feeder heifers selling steady. Receipts were low and buyer interest was focused on those weaned individuals due to another day of extreme heat. Slaughter cows were steady to 4.00 lower on a plain offering. Slaughter bulls traded steady. Supply included: 75% Feeder Cattle (14% Steers, 54% Heifers, 32% Bulls); 10% Slaughter Cattle (80% Cows, 20% Bulls); 15% Replacement Cattle (18% Bred Cows, 76% Cow-Calf Pairs, 6% Bulls). Feeder cattle supply over 600 lbs was 13%.
