"I cannot wait to play Lakefest in Jamestown!" Brown said from his Simpson County home last week.

to Kentucky," Marty saw the words "Trust Jesus" scrawled on a sidewalk in front of a firm which represented songwriters.

"I looked up at the sky, and just took me a deep breath, and I went in there," Brown told USA Today.

An agent listened to him perform eight songs and agreed to try to help him get a recording contract.

Ironically, Brown also found himself the subject of a CBS-TV news documentary on country music which allowed him to not only demonstrate his songwriting talent, but also showed his affable, down-home personality.

Before long, the lanky, soon-to-belegend in the beat up cowboy hat was the subject of a bidding war among Nashville's biggest record companies.

With his star on the rise, Brown found himself achieving a pinnacle of performers - performing at "The Mother Church of Country Music."

"When I played the Ryman Auditorium, it was the best sound system I had ever sang through, and it was one proud moment for this ol' country boy from Maceo, KY.," Marty

One of his biggest

clams to fame was his involvement in writing "I'm from the Country" - a top hit for fellow artist Tracy Byrd.

Brown is also known as a semifinalist on "America's Got Talent."

"I couldn't believe it when my performance on 'America's Got Talent' went viral to over 20 million people all over the world," he

Adding to his accolades, later this year, Brown will receive one of the highest honors for a musician in the Bluegrass State.

"I'm so proud to be from Kentucky," he said, "and I'm so proud to be going into the Kentucky Music Hall of Fame as part of the Class of 2022."

But before then, Marty said he is eager and excited to visit Russell County and make some new friends and fans.

"It's gonna be one heck of a great time!" he promises. "I'm Marty Brown, and I'm from the country and I like it that way - just like the hit song I wrote."
