presented a total of \$91,610.91 to the Russell County School System.

Since 2014 (Except during the pandemic), gospel musician/humorist Williams has held concerts in his hometown to raise money for children facing challenges.

"I was one of those kids," he said. "I was a kid who grew up in a trailer park here in Russell County and I had a lot of help."

Williams has performed all over the globe, and is known for his work with the Gaither family and numerous other gospel legends.

Each year he looks homeward.

"In 2014, we set out to do something really kinda unheard of and crazy to help future generations," he said. "I poured this little idea out to this precious community...'

"In this society today, you see a drastic lack of motivation to go out and be something," Williams said. "You see a lack of role models... and I could go on and on down the list."

Always armed with an impressive array of facts and figures, Williams said one of every three children in Russell County "is in

"We wanted to take a plained. "And it begins with meeting some basic needs. So we said,

'Can we maybe provide shoes for a kid that needs shoes?'

"The county game together that first year in 2014 and raised \$20,000," Williams proudly recalls. "And it has kept going up and

Which made last Thursday very special.

"It's a very meaningful day for me," Williams said.

The nearly \$92,000 raised through fundraising efforts and a recent free concert at the Russell Springs First Baptist Church will be distributed to each resource center "based on the number of kids served," he told the board.

"This probably couldn't happen someplace else," he said. 'There's no other county out of 120 counties in Kentucky doing this and doing it this way for the kids. You're looking at a grassroots effort right here in Russell County."

Williams praised the Russell County School Board for their support and involvement.

He also pointed out money raised for Kevin's Kids is in a "protected fund...used only for these needs."

"I'm grateful for that," he said.

He applauded resource centers for the work they do to meet specific needs for

"They've been great stewards of this money," Williams said. "They have managed it so well. They're truly amazing people."

**Russell County** School Superintendent Michael A. Ford informed Williams funding through Kevin's Kids is doing more and more for local children - including things such as assisting with dental needs.

"There's no funding stream for that type of stuff," Ford said. "We would have never been able to do those types of things....without Kevin Williams."

"There's all kinds of things we never dreamed of when we started," Williams said.

"We're pretty proud

of this," he said. "This couldn't have been done without a county that cares."

Williams said Kevin's Kids has gained recognition over the years, and even has annual, out-of-state donors.

"We are truly blessed," he said. "We've all been a part of the success of this program."

As Williams departed, Russell County School Board Chairperson Sheila Wicker asked to make a comment.

"This is what out students can look up to," she said of Williams. "This is what Russell County is. We want to thank you for being a good role model."
