Coroner Tanya Womack said.

Blankenship “was swimming off the back of a houseboat” around 2 p.m. Friday, Womack said, “when he went under and never resurfaced.”

“Rescue personnel were on the scene and began the search immediately,” Womack said. “After approximately an hour, the search turned into a recovery effort.”

Blankenship’s body was recovered around 10 p.m. Friday.

A statement by the Jamestown Dive Team said the victim was found “in water that averaged around 28 feet deep.”

The Russell County Coroner’s Office, Jamestown Dive Team, Russell County Rescue Squad, State Fish & Wildlife, Taylor County/Campbellsville

Search & Rescue and Pulaski County Rescue Squad were involved in the search and recovery.

The Jamestown Dive Team said Safe Harbor Jamestown also offered assistance.

Blankenship’s death is thought to be the first, local drowning on Lake Cumberland this year.

(ARPA) funding the city has received.

Russell Springs Mayor Eddie Thomas said in a current climate where many private sector businesses are hiring new employees at \$15 or more an hour, the pay increase is justifiable.

“I think they deserve it,” Thomas said.

The mayor said some current city employees are only making around \$12-13 an hour.

“We need to be competitive,” Councilman Tom Holt said.

“We’ve got to be comparable,”

Councilwoman Sherry Bottom-Daniel agreed.

Mayor Thomas said a \$3,500 “lump sum” for employees was considered, but that amount would be heavily taxed.

He also endorsed a \$500 stipend for members of the Russell Springs Volunteer Fire Department.

“We don’t pay them anything,” the mayor said. “They’re volunteers. Every one of them worked through COVID. If we had a fire during COVID they couldn’t say, ‘We’re not going... we’ve got COVID.’ They had to jump in the fire truck and go.”

“We’re just benefiting our employees,” Mayor Thomas explained.

Several municipalities have used ARPA money to offset COVID expenses or reward employees who worked throughout the pandemic with “premium pay.”

The city also reported all departments are “under budget” for the fiscal year.

The practice of careful and cautious planning was praised, and Russell Springs City Clerk Christopher Ramsey was acknowledged by the council for his efficient and effective work.
