July 23, 1992

County man at an old abandoned rock quarry is under investigation.

The Russell County Senior Babe Ruth team won the championship of the South Central Kentucky Senior Babe Ruth League for the 1982 season. Russell County’s 10-1 league record was the best among the four team leagues which included Danville, Somerset, and London.

The Jamestown All-Stars girls’ softball team competed in the district tournament at Somerset.

Blue mold, a fungus disease that can be

damaging to tobacco crops, was identified in Russell County.

July 20, 1972
