After 20 years in lake

Crashed chopper retrieved

For 20 years, people far and wide have talked about "that helicopter that went in the lake."

There are various versions of what happened on Lake Cumberland two decades ago, but local entrepreneur Landon Helm "had a front row seat."

"I was there when it went down," he said.

Helm said he was on the main channel of the lake

- watching Poker Run festivities - when a small, two-person helicopter flying close to the lake's surface "went down" between Low Gap and Cemetery Island.

"I remember it like it was yesterday," he said.

Helm's memory was instrumental in helping divers find and retrieve the helicopter almost 20 years to the day it crashed.
