Water Team, Kentucky State Police, and others assisted.

Water was over the roads in many places throughout the county.

"When people get that close to dying, we need to get the awareness out," Matney said. "More people die in

flash floods than all other weather-related incidents combined. The numbers are consistent. Automobiles plus moving water is a death nail for a lot of folks."

Matney, an experienced rescue unit, said a large number of the fatalities are from people

trying to rescue other people.

"When that happens, call 911, and stay out of the water," Matney said. "People need to know that when water is moving 3 MPH it exerts 35 lbs. of pressure per square inch on any stationary object. If you're caught between water and a tree, the force is unbelievable. That's not bad as long as it's not that deep, but when you double that from 3 to 6 MPH, you quadruple the pressure. It goes to 140 lbs. of pressure at 6 mph."

It only takes a foot of gently moving water to wash away a car, 12 inches; if it's swift moving water, it can only take 8 inches.

"Anybody I've ever pulled out, they say 'I had no idea how powerful that water was,'" Matney said.

"That can happen to anybody in any county in the United States of America."

County to apply for Boat Launch Site funding

Green County Fiscal Court, in a special called meeting January 4, authorized County Judge-Executive John Frank to apply for the funding of a boat launch site to be located at the Russell Creek Road Bridge.

Magistrates also authorized Judge-Executive John Frank to enter into a lease agreement with the Kentucky Department of Fish and Wildlife Resources regarding the boat launch site property.

"With the Court's authorization, I will be applying for a boat launch site through the Kentucky Department of Fish and Wildlife," said Judge-Executive Frank. "If awarded, the ramp would be placed alongside the newly constructed bridge over Russell Creek. I have had numerous requests from fishermen as well as kayakers for

an access point to enter Russell Creek."

In other business, the Court approved:

(1) The Green County Sheriff's budget for calendar year 2022, estimated at \$465,267.42;

(2) To set the Sheriff's salary cap for calendar year 2022 regarding deputies, assistants, and other employees, at \$208,473.48;

(3) To accept excess fees from the Green County Sheriff's Department, totaling \$55,470;

"This is the first payment of excess fees from the Sheriff's office. It is anticipated that there will be an additional \$25,000 after collection of all taxes," said Judge Frank.

(4) An advancement to the Green County Sheriff's Department for calendar year 2022 estimated at \$35,000;

(5) A resolution regarding the adoption of Raymond Dobson Road into the county maintenance system.
