Tax bills mailed - A total of 1,100 city property tax bills have been mailed. The projected revenue is expected to be \$78,000.

Cow Days pro**ceeds** - The reported income received from Cow Days events was: ham breakfast, \$1,584; rides, \$1,197; nickel pitch, \$78; movies, \$255; popcorn sales, \$440; booth rental, \$1,910; and milking Annie, \$300.
