“Jane Todd Crawford Hospital has served the residents of this area for 60 years, and will keep on doing that well into the future.”

The event gets underway at 12 noon Central Time with a short program featuring remarks from Tungate, along with JTCH Board of Directors Chairman Ruthie Shuffett, and national, state and local dignitaries. A ribbon-cutting is set for 12:45 p.m., followed by the lunch and guided tours.

Visitors will be able to see all departments of the new hospital, where department directors and other employees will be on hand to answer questions.

The new 25-bed Critical Access Hospital (CAH) features 46,760 square feet. It was designed by JRA Architects of Lexington and built by Doster Construction Co., which is headquartered in Birmingham, Ala. Also involved in the project were CMTA of Lexington, Brown and Kubican of Lexington, and ACES of Bowling Green.

The \$26.1 million project also includes two administration buildings and a maintenance building, which sit adjacent to the hospital.

The new Jane Todd Crawford Hospital will replace the existing facility on Milby Street, which opened in 1962. Plans for that structure have not been finalized at this time.

Wade Cave, JTCH's Special Projects Coordinator and liaison for the hospital, has been involved with the project from the beginning. A first for him, he said overseeing the building of the new facility has been challenging at times, but well worth it.

“This has been a fun and exciting project,” Cave said. “Although stressful and overwhelming at times, we were able to overcome the obstacles and build a wonderful facility for the people of Greensburg and surrounding counties.”

Cave expressed appreciation to Tungate and the board for trusting him with the project, and has relished creating positive working relationships with many subcontractors, architects, engineers, and especially those involved with Doster.

“There are many people who deserve recognition for this project, especially our Board of Directors. This group has served the hospital for many years and without their dedica-

tion, this wouldn't have happened,” Tungate added.

Besides Chairman Ruthie Shuffett, other members of the board include Valerie Perkins, Joe Shuffett and Steve Lewis. All have served on the board for at least 16 years and have been instrumental in planning the Grand Opening Celebration, along with many features in the hospital.

One thing visitors will notice right away upon entering the new hospital is the towering cupola in the lobby. Ringing the interior of the structure are 12 80" x 38" pictures of various attractions found in Green County. The photos were all taken by local photographer/historian Lanny Tucker.

Also displayed on a wall in the lobby are framed, lighted drawings by local artist Betty Jo Shuffett, which depict the story of the hospital's namesake, Jane Todd Crawford.

“We are so grateful to both Betty Jo and Lanny for the contributions they have made to our new hospital,” said Ruthie Shuffett. “And we're so proud that we've been able to provide this new hospital to the citizens of Greensburg and Green

County. This has been a dream for the community that has been a long time coming. Now that it's here, it seems surreal.”

While the Grand Opening for Jane Todd Crawford Hospital is being held this weekend, Tungate said it will actually be a few weeks before the hospital will transfer its patients and begin full operations at the new facility. Moving is projected for Oct. 15-16.

“We're definitely looking forward to begin serving our residents at the new hospital,” Tungate said. “Many, many thanks to all those who have made it possible.”

## REQUEST FOR SOLID WASTE COLLECTION AND DISPOSAL FRANCHISE

**• Introduction**  
 Green County Fiscal Court is requesting submittals and bids for a franchise to perform solid waste collection and disposal services for any and all citizens and residents of Green County, Kentucky, excluding the City of Greensburg, who desire same, in accordance with the Solid Waste Management Plan adopted by the Green County Fiscal Court on September 21, 2017. All work and/or materials to be contracted must comply with all legal bidding requirements including, but not limited to, the provisions of K.R.S. 45A and 424.

**• Description of Project**  
 To provide for the storage, collection, transportation, processing, control, disposal and the containerization of solid waste for any and all citizens and residents of Green County, Kentucky, excluding the City of Greensburg, who desire same, in accordance with the Solid Waste Management Plan adopted by the Green County Fiscal Court on September 21, 2017. Said plan is available for inspection in the office of the Green County Judge-Executive, the Green County Public Library, and Greensburg City Hall.

**• Scope of Services**  
 The scope of the project could include, but not be limited to, the following services: any and all services as described in the Solid Waste Management Plan adopted by the Green County Fiscal Court on September 21, 2017. The Solid Waste Management Plan is available for inspection in the office of the Green County Judge-Executive located at the Green County Courthouse, 203 West Court Street, Greensburg, Green County, Kentucky 42743. The Solid Waste Management Plan is also available for inspection at the Green County Public Library and at Greensburg City Hall.

**• Content of Submittals**  
 The submittal(s) should contain the following information:

- A schedule of the kind of, and the frequency of, the services offered;
- The kinds of solid waste loads that would be collected, and the restrictions, if any;
- If the bid includes a transfer station, then the proposed location of the station, a set of plans for the proposed construction of the station, the kinds of solid waste loads that would be handled or received at a transfer station, the hours of operation of same, and the different fees to be charged by the grantee at the station to persons, firms, businesses, or governmental units delivering solid wastes to said station;
- The requirements, if any, for receiving loads at any transfer station from different persons, firms, businesses or governmental units;
- A schedule of the rates to be charged for services offered, itemized as per the various services and different alternatives;
- The amount of the franchise fee to be paid to the County for the granting of a complete operation franchise thereunder, which fee shall be not less than 8% of the gross revenues collected by the grantee in the case of total collection and disposal by the grantee;
- The date that the Franchisee would first provide all of its services, which shall be not later than January 1, 2023;
- Specifications as to the make, year and model and number of vehicles and other equipment proposed to be utilized by Franchisee;
- The number of men to be employed in the system, whether complete or simply a transfer station, and their hours on the job of collection and disposal;
- The term and duration of the franchise requested.

### PUBLIC NOTICE 2022 PROPOSED TAX RATE PUBLIC HEARING

The Green County Fiscal Court will hold a public hearing on September 29, 2022 at 4:00 P.M. Central time at the Courtroom of the Green County Courthouse for the purpose of obtaining comments from the public regarding the proposed tax rate. The Green County Fiscal Court remains committed to keeping tax rates as low as feasible. Tax rates for 2022 will remain the same as those in 2021. The Green County Fiscal Court has had the same rate (10.4) on real estate since 2016 when the rate was lowered from 10.7. The tax rate levied last year was 10.4 cents per hundred dollars and produced revenues in the amount of \$420,249. This year's compensating rate is 10.1 cents per hundred dollars and will produce revenues in the amount of \$438,502. The Green County Fiscal Court proposes a tax rate of 10.4 cents per hundred dollars which will produce a total of \$451,526 in revenues. Revenue expected from New Property is \$15,922; revenue expected from Personal Property is \$51,927; revenue expected from Motor Vehicle is \$114,732; and revenue expected from Watercraft is \$3,399. Revenue received in excess of last year's revenue will be used for the county's General Fund and the operations of Green County government. The Kentucky General Assembly requires that the Green County Fiscal Court publish this notice with the above information contained herein.
