"The MS, with a big win, ran full strength for the first time in a few meets. Our young runners are improving every race," said Coach Edwards.

For the varsity Lady Dragons, Riley Coffey led the team with a second place overall finish in the 5K run. Her time was 21:54.89.

Isabella Day, of LaRue County, was the individual winner with a time of 20:34.89.

Green County placed third with 63 points. Taylor County was the team winner with 35.

"Overall, I think the girls ran really well. I have seen so much improvement over the past several weeks," said Assistant Coach Ashlyn Elmore. "Our biggest thing would be working on our one through five spread. If we pack together, break into some of those groups ahead of us, and push ourselves to run with a group we may not have ran with before, we would see significant changes in our team score!"

The middle school Lady Dragons were led by Abby Soto, who was second overall with a time of 13:23.18 in the 3K run.

Additional results included: 4. Lillie Creason, 13:39.57, 7. Haley Shelton, 14:37.18; and 23. Zoe Weddle, 17:46.57.

Maddi Bates, of North Hardin, was the individual winner, clocking in at 13:12.36.

Central Hardin was the team winner, scoring a perfect 15 points.

Green County's top male and female runner in the elementary 1600-meter run was Kohlter Froggett and Conleigh Cecil. Their times were 8:09.52 and 8:32, respectively.

Green County will compete this Saturday in the Hillbilly Run held at Thomas Nelson High School in Bardstown.
