Grand Opening of new JTCH is Saturday

For about 10 years, the property on Industrial Park Road in Greensburg sported a sign proclaiming it the future site of Jane Todd Crawford Hospital.

Many wondered when—and if—the new hospital would ever become a reality. And now it has. Thanks to the perseverance of many who refused to give up on making a new hospital a reality, the community can now be a part of the new Jane Todd Crawford Hospital's official Grand Opening on Saturday, Sept. 24. "We've waited a long time for this, and we're so proud and happy that this new hospital is getting ready to open

to serve the residents of Green County," said Rusty Tungate, Administrator/CEO of Jane Todd Crawford Hospital.

While many people have watched the construction of the new hospital since ground was broken on Feb. 26, 2021, the public will get its first look at the interior of the facility on Saturday as guided tours are a part of the Grand Opening Celebration. Lunch will also be served to all those attending, Tungate said.

"We want the community to very much feel a part of this," he said.

Fiscal Court considers the Industrial Park Site Development

Green County Fiscal Court, in its regular called monthly meeting, Thursday, Sept. 15, approved the authorization to execute a Memorandum of Agreement regarding the Industrial Park Site Development.

"Due to the efforts of Senator Givens and Representative Brandon Reed, several counties, including Green, have been given the opportunity to obtain funds to purchase property for industrial park site development. The Court voted to approve the memorandum, which is a much needed step to acquire the funds," said Judge-Executive John Frank.

In other business, magistrates approved:

(1) To rescind Bud-

get Amendment No. 23001;

(2) The first reading of Budget Amendment Ordinance No. 23001 for fiscal year 2022-23

with total amended revenues and appropriations amounting to \$235,021.20;

(3) A report from viewers regarding the

closure of Peachtree Road;

(4) A resolution regarding the discontinuance and closure of Peachtree Road in its

entirety;

(5) Resolution No. 2022-09-15 relating to the acceptance of the Green County Solid Waste Management

Plan 5-Year Update for Plan Years 2023-2027;

(6) Green County Sheriff's Local Tax Settlements for 2021 regarding the final audit;

(7) Authorization to execute agreement between the Commonwealth of Kentucky Transportation Cabinet Department of Rural and Municipal Aid and Green County regarding Flex Funds;

(8) A resolution adopting and approving the execution of a Rural Secondary Program Agreement between the Fiscal Court and the Commonwealth of Kentucky Transportation Cabinet Department of Rural and Municipal Aid, and accepting all roads and streets referred to therein as being part of the county road system;
