

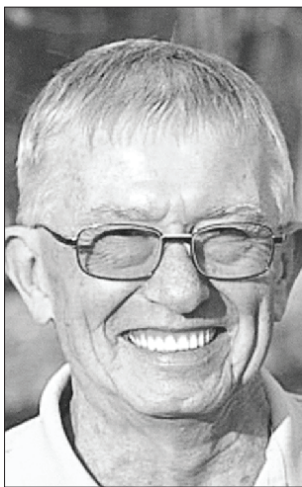
Henry Simmons Price, 79

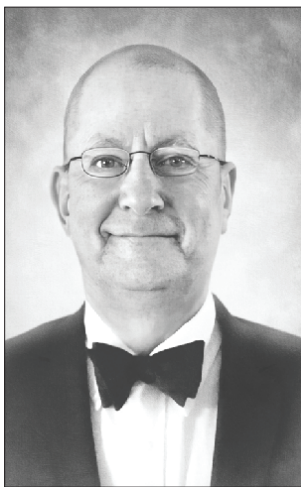

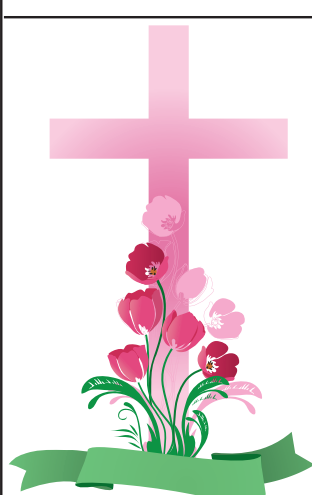
