clude a full day of activities, starting in the morning with a mission's fundraiser brunch and children's activities at the Greensburg Baptist Church.

At noon, the Green County Homemakers will sponsor the Christmas movie, "It's a Wonderful Life" and additional children's activities, sponsored by Community Trust Bank, will take place at the Community Center.
