2022 Spring Turkey Season Changes for Nonresidents on Mississippi Public Lands

Turkey hunters traveling to Mississippi in 2022 should be aware of changes on public lands during the spring season's opening two weeks. Nonresident hunters are now required to obtain a special, no-cost Public Land Endorsement in addition to other regularly required licenses when hunting any open public lands between March 15 - 28. The new endorsement will be allotted via a special drawing. Perspective hunters can apply between January 15 - February 15 on the Mississippi Department of Wildlife, Fisheries, and Parks' website. Once the application period closes, a drawing will be conducted and winners will be notified by email.

With its abundant public lands and one of the nation's earliest opening days, Mississippi has long been a popular destination for travelling hunters seeking to kickoff spring turkey season prior to its arrival in their home states. However, non-resident license sales have doubled in the past three years, with the majority of the out-of-state interest concentrated

during the season's opening weeks. This increased demand, coupled with mounting concerns about the well-being of turkey populations, led Mississippi's Commission on Wildlife, Fisheries, and Parks to set forth the new license endorsement as a way of managing pressure on a limited wildlife resource.

The public land license endorsement requirement is not applicable to nonresidents hunting on private lands, nor to those visiting Mississippi's public lands after March 28th. Hunters desiring to hunt Wildlife Management Areas (WMAs) with an existing permit-only season from March 15 - 28 will still have to apply to those specific WMAs separately through the traditional process shared by residents.

Public Hearing Notice Rural Area Program

The Sunflower Humphreys Counties Progress, Inc. of Indianola, Mississippi, is applying to the Mississippi Department of Transportation, Public Transportation Division, for assistance through its Rural Area Program to provide public transportation services within **Holmes County**. Funding is available to state agencies, local public bodies and agencies thereof, non-profit organizations, operators of public transportation services in locations other than urbanized Area, and, under special circumstances, private operators of public transportation on a competitive basis to undertake eligible transportation activities.

The goals of the Rural Area Program are: to enhance the access of people in non-urbanized Area to health care, shopping, education, employment, public services and recreation; to assist in the maintenance, development, improvement, and use of public transportation systems in the rural and small urban Area; to encourage and facilitate the most efficient use of all federal funds used to provide passenger transportation in non-urbanized Area through the coordination of programs and services; and to provide for the participation of private transportation providers in non-urbanized transportation to the maximum extent feasible.

The purposes for which these funds can be used are capital purchases that include such items as support vehicles, communication equipment, wheelchair lifts, etc.; administrative costs that include such items as salaries, office supplies, insurance, etc.; and operating expenses that include such items as driver's wages, fuel, oil, etc. More specific details regarding eligible activities, program requirements and the program criteria will be provided at a public hearing which will be held at **6:00 p.m. on Wednesday, January 26, 2022 via zoom.
