WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors (the "Governing Body") of Holmes County, Mississippi (the "County"), acting for and on behalf of Supervisor District Three of the mines, adjudicates and declares as follows:

 The District is authorized by Section 19-9-1 through 19-9-29, Mississippi Code of 1972, as amended and supplemented from time to time, Sections 17-3-1, Mississippi Code of 1972, as amended and Sections 55-9-1, Mississippi Code of 1972, as amended (together, the "Act"), to issue bonds hereinafter proposed to be issued for paragraph 2 of this preamble.

 It is necessary and in the public inter-to issue General Obligation Road and Bridge Bonds (the "Bonds") of the District in the principal amount of not to exceed Two Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$200,000) to raise money for the purpose of constructing, reconstructing, and repairing roads, highways and bridges, and acquiring the materials, and rights-of-way therefor, including rights-of-way therefor for constructing and equipping walking trails, public parks and recreation facilities beside District of heavy construction equipment and accessories thereto reasonably required to construct, repair and renovate roads, highways and bridges and approaches thereto within the District; and for related purposes and other authorized purposes under the

sessment for taxation, the assessed value of all taxable property within the District is \$20,115,562.00; the District has \$3,017,334.30 outstanding bonded indebt-edness subject to the fifteen percent (15%) debt limit prescribed by Section 19-9-5, Mississippi Code of 1972, as amended, and \$4,023,112.40 outstanding bonded and floating indebtedness subject to the twenty percent (20%) debt limit prescribed by Section 19-9-5, Mississippi Code of 1972, as inafter proposed to be issued pursuant to the Act will not result in bonded indebtedness of more than fifteen percent (15%) of the assessed value of taxable property withness, both bonded and floating in excess of twenty percent (20%) of the assessed value of taxable property within the District, and will not exceed any constitutional or statu-tory limitation upon indebtedness which may be incurred by the District.
