Holmes-Humphreys Regional Correctional Facility Found 100% Compliant

On September 5-7, 2022, Holmes-Humphreys County Regional Correctional Facility under the leadership of Sheriff Willie March and Warden Barry Rule was audited by the American Correctional Association. The American Correctional Association is a private, non-profit, non-governmental trade association and accrediting body for the corrections industry, the oldest and largest association in the world.

The visiting committee toured the entire facility and reviewed all file documentation of the facility's operation. The facility was found to be in 100% compliance with all mandatory standards and 100% compliance with all nonmandatory standards. One hundred and fifteen (115) standards were found to be nonapplicable because the facility does not provide these services as they relate to its operation.



ACA accredits over 900 prisons, jails, community residential centers and various other correctional facilities in the U.S. and internationally, using their independently published standards manuals. HHCRCF participated in an audit using the new fifth edition standards manual entitled "Performance-Based Standards and Expected

Practices for Adult Correctional Institutions that was implemented in March 2020. This manual has sixty-four (64) mandatory standards/expected practices and five hundred and fifteen (515) nonmandatory standards/expected practice.
