Lord why?

John 9:1-3 tell us that Jesus passed a man who was blind from birth, and His disciples asked Him, saying, "Master, who did sin, this man, or his parents, that he was born blind?"

Jesus answered, "Neither hath this man sinned, nor his parents: but that the works of God should be made manifest in him."

The Rev. Butler preached from John 9:1-3 – "Lord why? – It's all in God's plan."

The Rev. Butler explained John 9:1-3 – "Jesus' disciples assume that the man they've passed by must be blind as a punishment for something. For them, this raises a difficult question: did the man somehow sin before he was born, or is he being punished for his parents' sin? This suggests the concept of 'karma,' which implies that all suffering in this life is payment, or punishment, for prior acts of wrongdoing. Jesus' answer clearly and definitively refutes these ideas."

The Rev. Butler encourages us to look at all the things we're going through in today's world. He mentioned, "Viruses, wild fires, uncertain weather, death of loved ones, locked out of our churches, rising prices, evil doers, political upheaval, marchers in the streets; there seems to be trouble on every side – it's hard sometimes not to ask God 'why?' – but it's all in His plan. God is in control of the victory."

If we could always understand what God is doing, we would not be impressed with Him, and we could not worship Him. We are not that bright. Nobody is. Not even the greatest leader, philosopher or politician compares to God. God is so much greater than any or all of us.

A verse from the Bible that helps me put things in perspective is Proverbs 3:5-6: "Trust in the Lord with all your heart; do not lean on your own understanding; in all your ways acknowledge Him and He will direct your paths."

I hope you caught what these verses are saying? Don't try to understand. Don't try to figure out everything that is happening in your life. Just trust and obey, just live in deep reliance on God, and it'll be all right.

Jesus learned obedience by the things He suffered. What are you learning from the things you are suffering?

God had only one Son, and not even He was exempted from suffering. Scripture and experience lets us know none of us will be either. We cannot solve the mystery of our suffering until we solve the mystery of His suffering.

Read John 9:1-12 – it contains the sixth of the gospel of John's seven miraculous "signs" of Jesus' divinity. This miracle was the healing of a man who had been blind since birth. Jesus corrects His disciples' misconceptions about sin and suffering, then granted this man an ability he had never had before.

In a very broad sense, it's true that all human suffering is the result of sin. Adam's disobedience brought death and destruction to the entire human race. It's also true that most of the pain we experience in life is caused by the sin of people – either ourselves or others. Violence, starvation, crime, broken homes and other effects of sin can impinge on people who are not directly to blame.

More specifically, though, Jesus' Words prove that not all suffering is punishment for sin. This man, in particular, did not experience blindness as any sort of judgment on sin, either his or someone else's.

In all fairness, if we ask the "Why me?" question in regard to our burdens, we should also ask it in regard to our blessings. We take for granted 100 days of perfect health and then grumble about one day of aches and pains. We drive the freeway hundreds of times without incident and then ask, "Why me?" the one time we have a flat tire or engine trouble. We casually accept when our family is together for the holidays, but when we are separated, we dwell on our loneliness.

How often do we say, "Why me?" as we count our blessings? Rather than feeling sad about what we go through and what we don't have, doesn't it make more sense to feel a kind of rejoicing over everything we've made it through and all that we do have?

There comes a time in all our lives when our troubled hearts evoke the anguished question, "Why me?" In the face of prolonged trials, Scripture teaches us to view our situations from God's perspective. When we seek the Lord in prayer and call to mind His faithfulness and promises, we are reminded that He is able to work all things for His glory and our good. So don't question His authority!
