Wake up and give God thanks

The Rev. Butler preached from Psalm 121 (“Wake up and give God Thanks”). Psalm 121 is one of the staples of the faith we learn early on then repeat often, especially in times of trouble: “I will lift up my eyes to the hills.” But what does it mean? And how does it speak to us today?

The Rev. Butler wants us to think about it: He asked “Where does your help come from?”

The psalmist answered with a clear and certain voice, “My help comes from Yahweh, who made heaven and earth” (Psalms 124:8).

The Rev. Butler said, “If your help comes from anything or anyone else other than the Lord God Almighty, you’re apt to be disappointed. People are likely to let you down when you need them most. Only God is ultimately steadfast and dependable.”

We hear over and over in the Scripture, “He alone is my rock and my salvation, my fortress — I will never be greatly shaken” (Psalms 62:2). “Yahweh is their strength. He is a stronghold of salvation to His anointed” (Psalms 28:8). “God is our refuge and strength, a very present help in trouble” (Psalms 46:1).

“Where does your help come from when money gets funny and your change is strange?” asked the Rev. Butler.

“Where does your help come from when you’re struggling? And,” he asked, “who do you turn to when there is trouble on every hand?”

His advice: “Wake up and lift up your eyes to the hills.”

When I heard the words, “I will lift up my eyes to the hills,” I thought of God’s dominion over all creation. As I can remember, that’s what we were taught: To lift up your eyes to the hills is to be reassured that God is all-powerful and in control. In the words of a song, “He’s got the whole world in His Hands.”

“We’re living in difficult times,” said the Rev. Butler, “family values and morals are in peril. Some things that used to be considered wrong have become acceptable. It would be easy for us to run away from all our problems and the troubles of the world,” Butler suggested, “but we must be careful not to run from God – run to God. God has not forgotten us – He’ll take care of us.”

But let’s talk about thanking God in advance. We all have dreams and goals that God has placed in our heart, things we’re believing for, situations we’re praying to turn around. These promises start off like seeds. They don’t come to pass overnight. There’s always a period of waiting involved.

From the time we pray till the time we see it come to fulfillment, that’s called the trial of our faith. This is when many people get discouraged and give up. They start believing the negative thoughts: “It’s never going to happen. It’s taking too long.”

Now, that seed is lying dormant. It still has potential, but you have to do your part and start watering the seed. The way you water it is by thanking God in advance. You can’t wait until you receive the promise. You have to thank God that the answer is on the way.

Maybe you’re struggling in your health. The medical report doesn’t look good. Don’t talk about how you feel. Say, “Father, thank you that I’m alive. Thank you that I’m strong. Thank you for a long life. You are satisfying me.”

That’s not just being positive. That’s watering the seed. God has not given us the power of fear – we just need to wake up and give thanks for the power of love and peace. Do you long for peace today? The Lord is your keeper; He will keep your life. God is able to do things above all that we can imagine – just wake up and say “thank you.” The Lord is our keeper, our protector – may you find hope and rest in Him.

I think it is important to recognize that the psalmist’s confidence in God is one that assumes there will be times of need, times of help. How can God be called a helper unless there is a trial in which we need such help. The child of God is not promised freedom from tribulation or challenge or storm. What is promised is that for all whose hope is God, none of these trials will separate us from Him. In the storm He is there ... always there.

All through the day say, “Father, thank you that whatever I touch will prosper and succeed. Thank you that I’m coming out of debt. Thank you that your favor surrounds me like a shield.”

When you thank God in advance for the answer, it not only waters the seed, but that strengthens your own faith. To wake up and to look up means one thing: You’re down. Yet your relief, your comfort, your help is to be found up where the Maker of heaven and earth resides.
