**Pictured above is the design of McCormick Veterans Memorial Park, which will be located on August St., across from Town Hall. The park will consist of the following: a veterans monument, a welcome monument, flag pole, a bronze battle cross monument, bronze seals of each branch of the military, metal benches, landscaping and more. Any of these items can be sponsored for a fee. The construction of the park will be paid for with Community Development Block Grant funds (CDBG). However, the items listed that will be going in the park will not. Therefore, we are seeking donations and sponsorships. Also, we have implemented a "Buy a Brick" program. Under this program, anyone can purchase a 4"x8" brick for \$100 or an 8"x8" brick for \$200 for themselves or a family member who served in the military. The name and information provided by you will be inscribed on the brick (see example above). Another option that will be available is that you can have your name, your family name, business, organization, club, etc. inscribed on the back of the veterans monument for a fee of \$400.
