

Peace officers make various arrests over the month of January

Various charges have been filed, and arrests made, in Wilkes County over the course of this past month by local law enforcement agencies. The arrests listed here are taken from the limited information in arrest reports provided by local law enforcement officers and no arrests are left out. An arrest does not imply guilt; criminal charges are merely accusations, and a defendant is presumed innocent unless proven guilty and convicted. Bond and/or release notes contained in this report are as of February 1. January Arrest Reports

James Joseph Samorian, 40, of Augusta GA was arrested by Wilkes County Sheriff Deputy D. King Jr on December 28 and charged with driving under the influence, speeding (17 miles over), and open container in vehicle. He was released on \$1,149 bond.

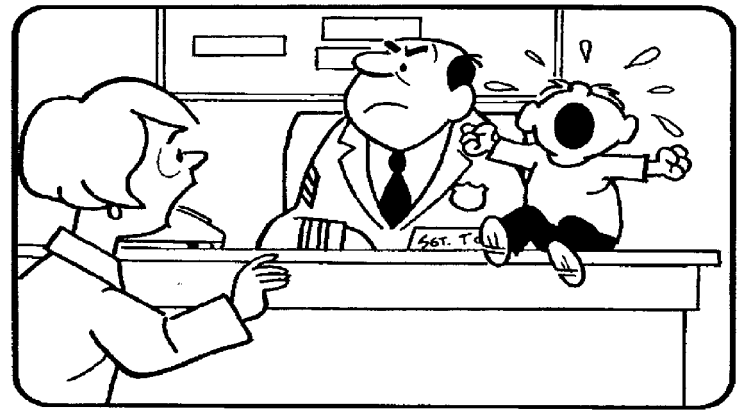

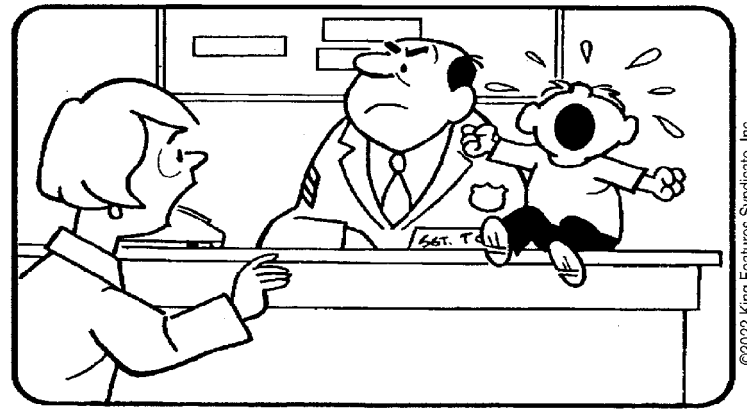

Washington-Wilkes Primary School to hold Kindergarten Registration March 7th thru 11th

The Washington-Wilkes Primary School will hold Kindergarten (5 year olds) registration for the 2022-2023 school year on Monday through Friday, March 7th through the 11th, 2022 from 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. daily. Registration will be held at the Washington-Wilkes Primary School. Any Wilkes County child who will be five years old on or before September 1, 2022 is eligible to attend.

Please call the school at 706 678-2633 if you have any questions.

The following items are required for each student, either during registration or before school begins in August:

- (1) Georgia Immunization Certificate from family doctor or Health Dept.
- (2) Georgia Certificate of Vision, Hearing, Dental and Nutritional Screening (New Form #3300) can be obtained from Health Dept.
- (3) Birth Certificate
- (4) Social Security Number

The above documents must be on file in the school office before your child begins school. All Kindergarten students are required to obtain a Vision, Hearing, Dental and Nutritional Screening Form # 3300 and Immunization record for the upcoming school year.

The Wilkes County Health Department will be administering these screenings this year. Everyone will need to

call the Wilkes County Health Department at 706-678-2622 for appointments or see your private physician for up to date Ga. Immunization Certificate and Certificate of Vision, Hearing, Dental and Nutritional Screening Certificate form #3300.

In order for your child to begin school on August 5th, 2022,

these certificates must be in his or her school records at the Primary School.

If you have any questions, please call (706) 678-2633.

In accordance with Georgia State Law, students will not be allowed to begin school without an Immunization Certificate which shows the student's shots are complete for school attendance.

The Wilkes County Board of Education is making every effort to inform parents with children in this age group of these educational opportunities. Your early registration is greatly appreciated as we make plans for a wonderful 2022-2023 school year.
