Karl Lee

Karl Duane Lee of Solo, Mo., passed away on November 18, 2021, at Phelps County Hospital in Rolla, MO., at the age of 92 years, 4 months, and 3 days.

Karl was born on July 15, 1929, to Conrad Z. and Georgia L. (Bush) Lee in rural Mattoon, Coles County, about 2 miles west on Route 16; that property would later become a driving range.

Karl was preceded in death by his parents; one sister, Connie Joan (Lee) Rowe and her husband Marwood Jr. Rowe of Creve Coeur (she was born in Allenville); one son, Steven Allen Lee, born in Peoria, died at Fallbrook, Calif.; one daughter, Carolyn Irene Drumond, born in Fallbrook, Calif., died in Oklahoma.

Karl is survived by his first wife, Dorothy Bowen Lee Metzger of Ripley, Okla., the mother of his six children; son, Raymond Lee, and his wife Connie of Cushing, Okla.; daughter, Suzanne Chastain and son of Chehalis, Wash.; son, Geary Lee, born in Peoria, now of Ripley, Okla.; daughter, Kathleen Hocking, born in Fallbrook, Calif., and her husband Mark of San Marcos, Calif.; eight grandchildren; 16 great-grandchildren; and 10 great-great-grandchildren; Karl has one living brother, Bobby Eugene Lee who was born in Allenville, and his wife Patricia R. (Davidson) (Shields) Lee who was born in Peoria; they now live in Arcola.

Karl attended grade school in Allenville, and Charter Oak in Peoria County. About 1943, Karl entered Dunlap High School in Dunlap, Peoria County; he enjoyed playing football on the high school team. About 1937, Karl's dad found employment at R.G. Letourneau in Peoria. He moved his family to Golden Acres in Peoria County, Peoria. Karl was employed at R.G. Letourneau from June of 1946 to December of 1947. April 21, 1948, Karl enlisted in the United States Marine Corps. He served at Camp Lejeune, N.C., Parris Island, S.C., California, and Korea, then back to California. Karl was promoted to Sergeant, June 9, 1951. On April 20, 1952, Karl was honorably discharged from the USMC; his job was a self-defense instructor.

After the military, Karl moved his family to Golden Acres, Peoria County. He purchased a Mobil Gas Station at Loucks and Sheridan Road in Peoria. It was called Karl's Mobil. After two years he moved his family to California and started a construction company. In the early 1970s, he and his son Raymond moved to Cushing, Okla., and started another construction company. In the early 1980s they moved to Houston, Mo., and started another construction company. Karl sold his business in

about 2015. While in California, Karl enjoyed building and driving rock climbing Jeeps, flying his airplane, playing guitar and

steel-guitar. He was privileged to get to play with Barbara Mandrell's dad. When Karl departed California Mr. Mandrell gave Karl a guitar that he played and kept until his death. He also enjoyed activities with his church, motorcycling, off-roading with his jeep, and playing steel guitar at Silver Dollar City in Branson, Mo. A memorial service will be held at 4 p.m. Sunday, Aug. 14, at French Cemetery in Allenville; Arcola Honor Guard, Arcola VFW Post #7862, and Arcola American Legion Post #0639 will conduct Military Rites. The family invites all who want to attend. Bring your chairs. The family will hold the ceremony.
