City finds, repairs large water leak, hopeful a years-long search is over

Tuscola city officials are hopeful they have found the big water leak that has been plaguing the city for years causing a large gap between the amount of water bought by the city and the amount sold to customers.

A leak was found at the corner of Carico and South Central streets. It went undetected for so long because it was feeding directly into the city's storm sewer, Denny Cruzan, city services forman, said.

City Administrator Drew Hoel said water usage in the city showed the least it's been in two years. He said it will take another month of billing to know whether this leak is the city's culprit. "Fingers crossed," he said.

In other water-related projects, Hoel said the new pipeline

to Cabot is "well underway." All six of the property owners who sold easements have signed the papers and have been paid, Hoel said. He said, "We are awaiting final approval of the railroad permit in order to make connections at the west end of the project, but that approval appears to be imminent." The project is being done through the Joint Water Agency co-owned by Tuscola and Arcola with a million-dollar contribution from the county.

During Monday's meeting, Mayor Daniel Kleiss commented on Tuscola's "girl power" noting the high school girls' track team winning the state tournament, the softball team winning its regional tournament and Tuscola High School alumnus and softball pitcher Morgan Day, who was

named most outstanding player after leading Oklahoma State to its first conference title since 1995.

The Council on Monday approved a payment of \$34,895 for engineering in preparation of paving alleys and parking lots downtown. Hoel said cost estimates have gone up, as was expected due to current market conditions, and that he will be discussing with committee members whether to scale down the project or proceed with bidding.

The proposed green space between the Community Building and The Vault will be included in a second phase of the downtown improvement project.

In other business, the city hired Jason Simpson for the street department at a wage of

\$24.50 per hour. The Council also approved a revised summer employee list and tourism board appointments.

All lifeguard training for the pool has been completed, and the pool has been drained, cleaned and refilled. It is expected to open May 28.

A Community Building lease was approved for Jasmine Lira for a Quinceanera June 24-26. Street closures were approved for outdoor movie nights downtown June 17, July 15 and Aug. 19 as well as an outdoor shopping event June 18.

Shipping for a street department truck and a mower previously approved by the Council have been delayed, Hoel said. The truck is expected to ship in the next few days while the zero-turn mower has been delayed about two months.
