Madison County Transit recently donated several RECON Interceptor Power Bicycles to the City of Venice Police Department. The new ruggedized bikes will allow officers to patrol both the streets and neighborhoods of Venice as well as the MCT Trails. Since police officers in uniform ride MCT fixed-route buses for free, and all MCT buses are equipped with bike racks, officers can take advantage of the bike & bus program to travel throughout the community as well. In the last five years, MCT has donated patrol bicycles to police departments in Alton, East Alton, Edwardsville, Granite City, Maryville, Highland, Troy, and South Roxana.

Mission partners (employees) at OSF HealthCare Saint Anthony's Health Center in Alton marked the Great American Smokeout on Nov. 17 by learning about a new way to quit. They also reviewed myths about smoking cessation, such as the use of laser therapy, acupuncture and hypnosis.

The new "Courage to Quit" program from the Respiratory Health Association is a free, evidence-based three-session program where participants will understand why they smoke, smoking cessation methods, smoking triggers, relapse prevention, social support and more.

Lewis and Clark Community
College has debuted a free, lighted
holiday trail at its main campus, 5800
Godfrey Road, Godfrey. Helping to get
everyone into the spirit of the season,
the college invites the public to enjoy
"Hiking Through the Holidays" along
the ¼-mile trail beginning behind the
Andy Simpson Tennis Complex and
running along the back of the campus.

Open from 5 to 9 p.m. on Fridays and Saturdays through Dec. 23, this event is part of L&C's efforts to build and support a transparent and inclusive campus culture and to build community partnerships throughout the district.

Due to uneven terrain, the trail is not wheelchair accessible. Visitors are advised to wear sturdy footwear and use caution on the path. Should the trail be closed for inclement weather any time during the season, updates will be posted to the college's Facebook page and website at www.lc.edu/hiking.

BJC Healthcare is developing a 14,000-square-foot outpatient care facility in Godfrey, with additional shell space for future expansion, at the corner of Godfrey Road and Celesta Street. The new BJC Outpatient Center will offer care for patients of all ages, with space for primary and specialty care, laboratory and radiology services.

Additionally, **BJC Medical Group** will relocate its Alton Memorial Convenient Care to this new Godfrey Road location. The building is within the **Alton Memorial Hospital** EMS coverage area, and an ambulance post will be established at the location.

SCOUT Capital Group of St. Louis, Mo., is the developer. **IM-PACT Strategies** is collaborating with SCOUT and BJC on construction and buildout. The facility is forecasted for completion by Summer 2023.

The **Southern Illinois Builders Association** recently held its Fall Industry Reception and Annual Meeting. In conjunction with this event, the Southern Illinois Builders Association's Leadership

Development Council held a toy drive with all donations and proceeds to benefit **Caritas Family Solutions** in Belleville.

SIHF Healthcare and Touchette
Regional Hospital broke ground in
late November at the site that will soon
be the only Urgent Care offered in the
East. St. Louis metro region. As a part
of the LifeBridge campaign, it will be a
5,000-square-foot addition to an existing
SIHF Healthcare health center at 2001
State Street, East St. Louis. The addition
will include four exam rooms and one
procedure room plus lab and radiology
services. This is a \$2.8 million investment,
partially funded by the State of Illinois.

The LifeBridge campaign is the umbrella name specific to the Transformation project that will co-exist with SIHF Healthcare, Touchette Regional Hospital, and their partners. In addition to the construction of this Urgent Care addition, the Transformation project also includes community health workers, a community health hub, affordable and supportive housing, improved access to specialty care, and a new electronic health record system at Touchette.
