Secretary of State Departments and Drivers Services Facilities Closed Through Jan. 17

VID-19 cases

Online services remain

Due to an increase in COV-ID-19 cases statewide, Illinois Secretary of State Jesse White is announcing that all Secretary of State departments will not conduct in-person transactions – including Driver Services facilities – from Jan. 3, 2022, through Jan. 17, 2022. All departments and Driver Services facilities will reopen on Tuesday, Jan. 18. White is encouraging the public to visit

Due to increase in CO- main open for all departments to conduct office services, including, but not limited to the following:

Renewing a license plate sticker.

Renewing a driver's license or ID card for those who qualify (individuals may call 217-785-1424 to confirm their eligibility or to obtain their

Obtaining a duplicate driver's license or ID card.

In addition, the Drivers and Vehicles Services hotline phone number will remain open at 800-252-8980. Customers with issues involving administrative hearings may email adminhearings@ilsos. gov or call 312-793-3722 or

217-782-7065. As a reminder, White has extended all driver's license and ID card expiration dates to March 31, 2022. This extension does not apply to commercial driver's licenses (CDL) and CDL learner's permits.

"After careful consideration and out of an abundance of

caution, we have decided to close all Driver Services facilities beginning Jan. 3, 2022, through Jan. 17, 2022, due to the spike in COVID-19 cases," said White. "The health and safety of employees and the public remains paramount, and face-to-face transactions potentially increase the further spread of the virus. Our goal is to safely reopen all offices and Driver Services facilities on January 18 for face-to-face transactions."


In addition, White greatly expanded remote renewal for driver's license and ID card holders. Since this fall,

White's office has mailed letters to eligible customers with expired driver's licenses and ID cards requiring them to renew online, by phone or by mail. The office estimates that this helps to eliminate the need for approximately 1 million people to visit a facility.

The U.S. Department of Homeland Security has extended the federal REAL ID deadline to May 3, 2023.

New Niches Make History in Homer Cemetery

December 9, 2021 history was made in Homer with the addition of Columbarium niches. The set of three Columbarium niches were placed in section 31 of the Grand Army of the Republic (GAR) cemetery. Adams Memorials of Champaign placed the memorials in the morning.

Joe Bear, head of the cemetery board, supervised the placement.

These Columbarium niches are constructed of granite and required a crane to place the heavy structures. The concrete base was previously poured making the site ready for installation.

Staff Writer A GriefShare Program, hosted by Stella Lambdin, and sponsored by the Atwood First Baptist Church, will begin their program of 13 video sessions on Monday, January 17 through April 11. Sessions are every Monday from 6-8 p.m. in the church Fellowship Hall, 231 N. Illinois St.,

If you have experienced the loss of a loved one, this group

will help you through your for the workbook only! journey "From Mourning to Joy!" Each weekly session starts out with a 40-minute video, a time for snacks and the most important part...a time to share with one another. No one is required to share; however, you are encouraged to participate. You will also have a workbook to help you take notes and short daily readings to help you get through your week. Cost for this program is \$20 per person

Stella states, "When my pastor, Pastor Woody White of First Baptist Church of Atwood, approached me about starting a GriefShare program, I jumped at the opportunity! Since my mother passed in 1988, I felt there has been a real need for something to help grieving people. In 2011, that need became even more real when I lost my husband of 37 years. Yes, myself and our other leaders

know all too well what grief feels like, and how it does not end after the funeral."

This program is Christian led and biblically based; however, you do not need to be a Christian or a church member to attend.

We would like to share anonymous quotes from former participants. Each one was asked, "Has GriefShare had any impact on your life? If so, how?

Participant #1

"It's so nice when you are able to share your story and learn that you are not the only one feeling the way you do. It's nice to know that it's OK to grieve and OK to have joy."

Participant #2 remarked:

"Absolutely! This session has made a huge impact on me and pushed me a little further through my grief, I needed to be nudged to face my emotions!"

Participant #3: "Yes. I realize more about the individuality of grief (we're all at our own place of grieving & our own pace), but also the commonality of the group—we are all grieving."
