The Lyrids are the first notable shower of the year. They result from the Earth crossing the path of Comet Thatcher, a comet taking over 400 years to orbit the Sun. Even on a clear, dark night, you may only see a dozen meteors per hour. Next week is International

Dark Sky week and a chance to celebrate a vanishing natural resource – our prairie skies.

You can help! Go outside some evening and evaluate your own exterior lighting. Are you shining light upwards? That's wasted energy! If you add a reflector, you'll achieve the same illumination on the ground with a lower wattage bulb and save money! Are you creating shadows where potential criminals might hide? The key is you should be able to see what you

are trying to light and not the light source itself. Look up and see how many stars you can see in your sky, then join the CU Astro Society on April 29 (if clear) at the Middle Fork River Forest Preserve and compare. We'll have a couple of telescopes handy to show you the sights. Call 217-351-2567 if the weather is iffy.
