North Central loses 22-7 against Keenan Raiders

North Central dropped its 3rd straight game to fall to 1-3 after a 22-7 road loss against the Keenan Raiders(Columbia, SC).

North Central relied on sophomore Quarterback Kade Baxley(#9) who dropped back 17 times for 8 completions and 60 yards. Senior Casey Shropshire(#1) led the struggling

rushing corps and had 26 carries for 76 yards.

Jordan Joe(#13) led in receiving, hauling in 3 balls for 33 yards. Jonathan Clarkson(#4) had the longest catch of the day on a lone completion for 14 yards.

The Knights score came on a fumble recovery by Safety Ethan Diles(#14) who scam-

pered for 28 yards for the touchdown. Diles also showed some promise with 6 tackles including 3 solo tackles to his credit.

The 1-3 Knights will face their last non-region opponent in the 3-1 Crestwood Knights(Sumter, SC) on Friday at home, before a bye week on the 22nd and beginning region play on the 29th.

Lancaster team headed to 9/11 Memorial Stair Climb



(Friday, 9/8/2023) Members of Lancaster County Fire Rescue and volunteers from various Lancaster County volunteer fire departments have formed a team to participate in the 9/11 Memorial Stair Climb in Charlotte on Saturday, September 9, 2023.

A group of firefighters from Lancaster County participate in the event every year. The event is a way to honor FDNY firefighters who made the ultimate sacrifice, while also raising funds for the National Fallen Firefighters Foundation.

Each firefighter who participates in the Climb is given the photo of a firefighter who died during the events that happened on September 11, 2001. The funds collected during the event help to provide assistance to the surviving families and co-workers of those 343 firefighters.

The Lancaster team, called the "Sleepless Knights," is number eight in donation collections out of hundreds of teams. 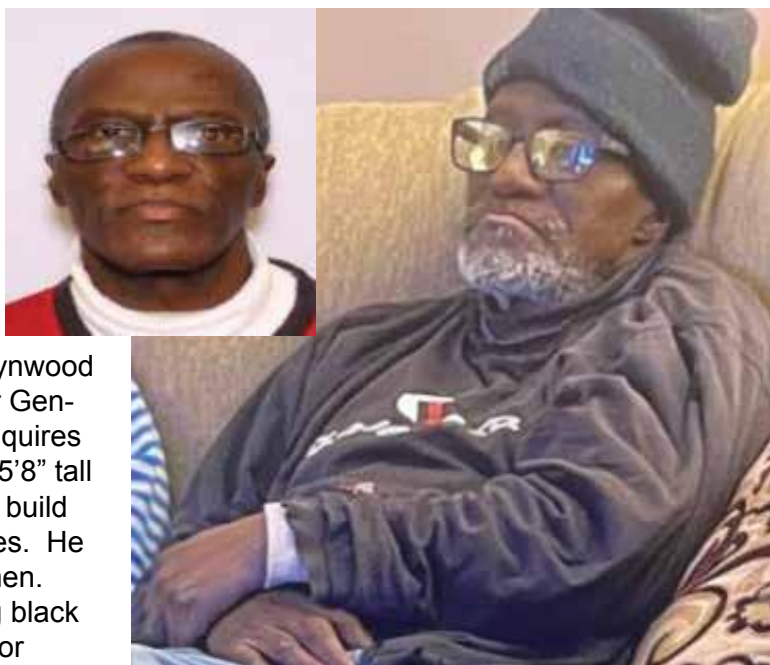
New Town of Kershaw Tennis Courts!

Update August 21, 2023

Danny K. Squires has not been located despite extensive and ongoing efforts to find him. Personnel from the Lancaster County Sheriff's Office, Lancaster County Fire-Rescue, Lancaster County Emergency Management,

Lancaster County Emergency Medical Services, the South Carolina State Law Enforcement Division (SLED), the South Carolina Department of Natural Resources (DNR), and the York County Sheriff's Office have participated in the search. K-9s, drones, and a helicopter have been deployed. Mr. Squires was last seen leaving his home
