

# Meadows Park trail wrapping up soon

Mustang's newest trail is available for the public to use.

The project, which the City of Mustang originally addressed in June during a city council meeting, has gone through the entirety of the process of construction to the surrounding Mustang communities benefit. Ryan Conner, the City Planner for Mustang, provided an update regarding the project.

"All the paving is

completed," Conner said.

"...The only thing we're waiting (on) for the project to be wrapped up with is the lighting. So, they had some special, we're actually doing silver lights out there. And so, we're waiting on some parts backordered for those to be installed. But the physical trail is already out there."

Conner said the project had put the pavement in for the trail multiple weeks ago. The project had been worked on with the intent to get the lights installed soon after the

paving was placed in the trail, which has turned the project into a longer process.

People can use Meadows Park's trail in the day while the lighting is not impacted.

"It started with the monies being given through a grant," Conner said. "So, we applied for some CDBG funds, which is going to be 80% federal money and 20% local matching money to make something like that possible for us."
