Rob Groseclose has been the Chief of Police for the City of Mustang for seven years, and is in his 30th year as a law enforcement professional.

Groseclose said his officers came up with a motto years ago, basically incorporating the department's core values.

"Our core values are serving with honor, our integrity, and professionalism," the chief said Monday, September. "We, in my opinion, have the highest caliber police department and officers that I've ever been around in my entire career and I know I'd put them up against anybody in the State of Oklahoma. I can't express how proud I am of these guys and how proud

I am to be a part of this city." Groseclose said he appreciates the support the Mustang Police Department gets from all angles.

"It's amazing," Groseclose said. "From my boss, the city manager, to our city council to the citizens themselves, I have never felt such support and I've been doing this job for 29 years. I've been at five different agencies and I have never felt anything like the support that we have here in Mustang."

Chief Groseclose broke down some of the recent and upcoming developments that the department is excited about.

"This year is pretty significant for us. We're hosting some really big national training this year. In addition to



that, we're also transitioning all of our people to the miniaturized red dot on pistols, so we'll be issuing basically the top-of-the-line pistol, and these guys already have amazing equipment, but this just keeps us really ahead of the curve, the direction that

most every agency is going. We're very proud to be able to do that, and excited to have that done hopefully by the end of the year. "Also, we've developed a rotation over the last seven years
