The Historical Society of Lake Worth will feature "The True Story of the Ashley Gang" on Thursday, Mar. 23 at 7 p.m. in the Gallery Room of the Lake Worth Beach Library. Steve Carr, native of Lake Worth, who is recognized as the foremost authority on the Ashley Gang, will present the program.

Carr has spent years researching the Ashley Gang and has donated artifacts to the Elliott Museum in Stuart for a featured display on the Ashleys. Last season he was featured on Josh Gates' TV series Expedition Unknown as he led Gates through the areas the gang frequented and eventually he and Patrick Mesmer revealed the actual location of the gang's

hideout.

Carr will relate tales of the exploits of the Ashley Gang including how a Lake Worth connection plays into it. The door on the ramp on the Lucerne Avenue side of the Library will open at 6:30 for social time before the program. 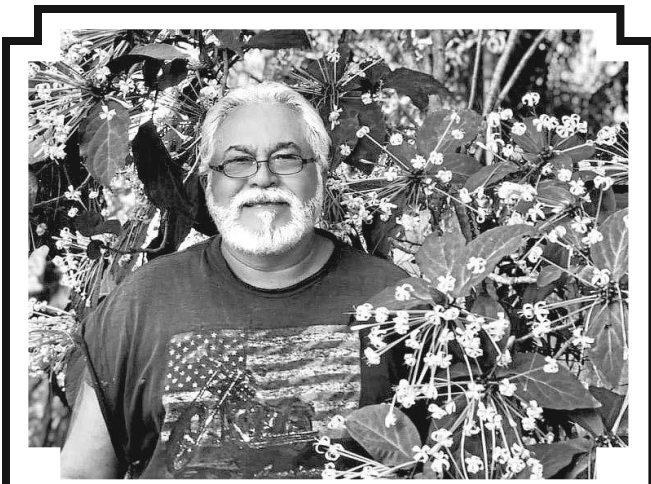
League of Women Voters of PBC Free Public Zoom Event

LOOKING BACK

Casino Due To Get More Remodeling

The recently enlarged, remodeled and dedicated ocean-front Municipal Casino is scheduled for even more remodeling, according to action taken Monday night by the City Commission.

Upon recommendation of Frank Clark, city manager, the board members authorized the addition of three items to the contract. One of the items will be the repair and remodeling of the northeast corner of the building to make it conform in appearance to the new structure.

The cost of the additional work will be approximately \$1,305 in addition to \$162 previously approved for new doors to the Casino grill.

The board also heard from the city manager that the stage in the ballroom is not sufficiently large for big orchestras and that he had ordered construction, prior to the dedication ball, of a stage addition. The addition is portable and can be placed around the band stand when desirable. This item costs \$297.98, it was revealed.

Another item approved

calls for construction of a gate in the stairway leading to the ballroom and roof garden at a cost of \$47. Clark told the board members this gate is necessary to keep persons from going into these places and will also stop the practice of some youngsters climbing to the top and then down into the pool without paying.

Bingo Lid Remains On, Sheriff Says

The bingo lid remains on and will remain so "until the governor says otherwise," Deputy Sheriff C.B. Bowen stated this morning.

"We haven't had a thing on bingo since we received the order from Governor Warren to stop all gambling in Palm Beach County," he added.

"It certainly isn't our wish to close up bingo, especially games

conducted for charity by such organizations as the American Legion, VFW and Elks, but what can we do! The man says close it up, so we do just that," Bowen said.

In answer to a question Bowen said he understood a number of Lake Worth organizations and civic leaders, as well as organizations in other parts of the county,

had wired the Governor a protest to his "bingo ruling." When asked if he thought this would bring about a change, Bowen said, "no comment."

A concession, which in some quarters is believed to be the first sign of a change of mind by the Governor, was granted the Sun Dance Committee of West Palm Beach. It was pointed out, however, the "permission to operate games without money changing hands" did not come direct from Governor Warren even though it did originate in Tallahassee.

Sun Dance officials, it was stated, contacted a number of officials in order to get the ruling relaxed. It was pointed out several thousands of dollars were at stake and the various civic groups that underwrote the project stood to take a large loss if the order was not relaxed.

WEAT Asks Right To Move Studio

Request of R. W. Roundasville, owner of Radio Station WEAT, for a release from the stations rental agreement for the top northwest wing of the Municipal Casino where its studios are housed, was passed by the City Commission Monday night to City Manager Frank Clark for negotiations. Roundasville claimed

in his request that space is not adequate nor suitable for radio broadcasting. He asked that the Station be given permission to vacate the Casino studio within six months after April 1.

The board was told by City Manager Clark that Roundasville, who appeared at the city board meeting but did not speak as he was absent when the request was brought up for discussion, had evaded the question as to whether he plans to move his station away from Lake Worth. It was reported last week by The Herald that Roundasville had requested and received permission from the Palm Beach Town Council to construct a tower in the waters of Lake Worth just north of the Palm Beach Biltmore Hotel.

The present WEAT tower is located on property in the north end of the city and sold to the former owner of the radio station. Roundasville took over the property when he acquired the station from W. H. Menser, who returned to New York after disposing of the holdings.

The possibility that the station would return the property, on which the present tower stands, for the release from the rental agreement of space at the Casino was discussed. Mr. Clark was instructed to look into this possibility.
